**SEC BASEBALL: SETTING THE STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE**



- The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 81-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition in baseball of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.
- A SEC squad has now appeared in the College World Series 30 of the last 31 years, including four teams in 2015. Seven SEC teams were selected for NCAA Regional play with five advancing to NCAA Super Regionals.
- The SEC has sent 54 teams to the College World Series since 1990. That was accomplished despite no SEC teams making the field in 1992. LSU has now been to Omaha 14 times, Florida nine times, South Carolina six times, Georgia and Mississippi State five times, Arkansas four times, while Alabama, Tennessee and Vanderbilt have been three times each. Auburn has been twice.
- SEC teams have won 10 of the last 25 national championships, with LSU winning six (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009), South Carolina winning two (2010, 2011), Vanderbilt taking home the title in 2014 and Georgia claiming the 1990 title. The SEC has finished runner up eight times in that span, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014.
- The SEC has averaged more than eight games played per year in the College World Series since 1990. In 2015, an SEC team played in each of the 16 games of the CWS. In 2004, 12 of the 15 games played in Omaha involved a SEC team. In 1997, the SEC had a team in 13 of the 14 games played in the CWS. Since 1990, an SEC team has played in 185 of the 376 games in the College World Series, an amazing 49 percent of games.
- The SEC has played 55 games in the “Final Four” of the College World Series since 1990, an average of over three per year. Only five times, 1992, 1994, 2003, 2006 and 2007 has the SEC failed to get a team to the “Final Four” of the CWS.
- The SEC Baseball Tournament drew more than 130,000 fans in 2015, better than 7,000 per game. The event has become the Birmingham metro’s highest attended sporting event annually, second in the state only to NASCAR races at Talladega. Birmingham Magazine recently named it the top sporting event annually in the Birmingham area. The entire SEC Baseball Tournament was broadcast live on national television for the first time in the history of the event.

**THE SEC IN 2015**

**SECond TO NONE**

In the past 25 years, the Southeastern Conference has been the top college baseball conference in the nation. Consider:

- Since 1990, 186 squads have received NCAA Tournament bids to lead the nation.
- A nation-leading 54 SEC teams have recorded College World Series berths since 1990, winning 10 of the last 25 NCAA titles (1990, 1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2014) and seven runner-ups (1997, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012 and 2013).
- Eleven different SEC squads (Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vanderbilt) have made CWS appearances since 1990, the most squads from a conference to appear in Omaha since that time.
- SEC squads have appeared in 30 of the last 31 NCAA College World Series, with the lone miss in 1992.
- Since 1990, 36 SEC squads have posted 50+ wins.

**SEC IN THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES**

Since 1990, the Southeastern Conference has been the most successful baseball conference in the country. The SEC has won 10 of the last 26 NCAA titles (1990, 1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2014), finished runner-up eight times and has put more teams in the College World Series than any conference in the country. The SEC has played in the CWS Championship Series eight consecutive years. Take a look at the SEC's success in the last 26 years:

**FLORIDA'S TOBIAS REPRESENTING SEC IN NCAA PROCESS**

Josh Tobias, a senior third baseman on the University of Florida baseball team is one of three student-athletes who have been named to represent the Southeastern Conference on proposed governance rule changes under the NCAA's recently adopted Division I autonomy process.

The three student-athletes represent the SEC as part of the Five Conferences (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac 12, SEC) to "engage and empower student-athletes by giving them both a voice and vote within a transparent decision-making process."

The NCAA Division I Board of Directors voted in August to restructure how schools and conferences govern themselves, paving the way for student-athletes to have a voice at every level of decision-making.

The new model grants flexibility to schools in the Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac 12 and Southeastern conferences to change rules for themselves in a list of specific areas within Division I. The legislative

**SEC IN THE MLB DRAFT FIRST ROUND**

• The SEC had seven players selected in the first round of the 2015 Major League Baseball Draft. Those seven picks represented five different schools. The SEC has now had a first-round MLB selection each year since 1991 and 105 total in the first round during that time.

- Vanderbilt's Dansby Swanson was selected by the Arizona Diamondbacks as the No. 1 pick in the 2015 MLB Draft. Swanson is the second Vanderbilt player all-time to be drafted No. 1, joining David Price from 2007.
- Vanderbilt had three first-round draft picks for the first time in school history – Swanson (Diamondbacks, 1); Carson Fulmer (White Sox, 8); Walker Buehler (Dodgers, 24)
- Vanderbilt became just the second school to ever have multiple No. 1 picks joining Arizona State.
- Swanson is the fourth SEC player to go No. 1 in the MLB Draft, joining Price, Luke Hochevar (Tennessee) and Ben McDonald (LSU).
- Swanson (Vanderbilt, No. 1) and Alex Bregman (LSU, No. 2) became the first duo in SEC history to go 1-2 in the MLB Draft.
- Bregman became the second-highest draft choice in LSU baseball history (behind McDonald) and he was the 18th LSU player to be chosen in the first round.
- Arkansas' Andrew Benintendi (Red Sox, 7th) became the third-highest MLB Draft pick in school history, behind Jeff King (No. 1 in 1986) and Kevin McReynolds (No. 6 in 1981).
- Richie Martin's (Athletics, 20th) selection marked the fourth time in four years that a Florida player has been taken in the first round.
- Christin Stewart (Tigers, 34th) became Tennessee's first first-round draft pick since 2009.

process for these 65 schools includes three student-athlete representatives from each conference who will vote on rule changes.

Voting on autonomy issues includes 15 student-athletes (three from each of the Five Conferences) who, collectively, will cast votes in greater number than four of the Five Conferences.

Tobias, a senior Geological Sciences - Environmental Geosciences major from Greensboro, N.C., was Florida's starting third baseman for most of the 2014 season while batting .305 for the SEC Champion Gator baseball team and helped lead UF to the College World Series his freshman year of 2012. He was a member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll each of the last two years as well as the First-Year Academic Honor Roll and SEC All-Freshman Team.

A member of the 2014 SEC Community Service Team, he participated in Climb for Cancer, a Florida student-athlete sponsored event; and the Annual Gator Tracks shoe drive, among other service projects. He is a member of the University of Florida Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and a Florida Letterman Award Committee Member and Presenter.

### **BENINTENDI NAMED KRAMER SEC ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

Former Arkansas baseball outfielder Andrew Benintendi was named the 2014-2015 Roy F. Kramer SEC Male Athlete of the Year by a vote of the league's athletics directors.

The SEC Athletes of the Year Awards were first presented in 1976 for men and 1984 for women. The award was renamed the Roy F. Kramer Athletes of the Year in 2004 to honor the former commissioner who served the conference from 1990-2002.

Benintendi became the fourth Arkansas athlete to ever win the honor, joining two-time winner Alistair Cragg (cross country/track) who won the award in 2003 and 2004, Amy Yoder Begley (cross country/track) in 2001 and Corliss Williamson (men's basketball) in 1994.

A native of Cincinnati, Benintendi won both the prestigious Dick Howser Trophy as the top Division I baseball player in the country and the Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top amateur baseball player. He was also named national player of the year by Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America as he led the country with 20 home runs.

The first SEC and National Player of the Year in program history, Benintendi is the first Division I player in seven years and first SEC player in nine years to hit 20 home runs and steal 20 bases in a season.

He led the SEC in batting average (.376), home runs (20), slugging percentage (.717), on-base percentage (.488) and walks (50) and became the third highest MLB draft pick in school history, taken No. 7 overall by the Boston Red Sox.

### **SEC BOASTED ALL FOUR GOLDEN SPIKES FINALISTS**

Arkansas' **Andrew Benintendi** was named the 2015 Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top amateur baseball player.

Of the 21 semifinalists that were voted on by a committee of more than 200 voters, Benintendi, an outfielder from Arkansas, **Alex Bregman**, a shortstop from LSU, **Carson Fulmer**, a right-handed pitcher from Vanderbilt, and **Dansby Swanson**, a shortstop from Vanderbilt, received the most votes and were named finalists for the award.

The four players were named finalists after receiving the most votes during the semifinalist balloting round.

### **LIPSCOMB, HECK EARN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS**

Mississippi State's **Seth Heck** and Auburn's **Cole Lipscomb** were named to the 2015 Capital One Academic All-America Division I Baseball Team. Heck is the 2015 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Heck is the 18th player in Mississippi State school history and the first since SEC Pitcher of the Year Chris Stratton in 2012 to earn academic All-America honors.

In the classroom, the Edmonds, Washington, native recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA every semester he spent studying in Starkville. The last two seasons, Heck has been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and has been

voted by the league's 14 coaches as the top scholar-athlete in the conference. This past month, Heck received his degree in business administration. Heck was also MSU's male nominee for the SEC H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Post-Graduate Scholarship, presented annually to the league's top scholar-athlete.

A native of Prattville, Ala., Lipscomb holds a 3.76 grade point average in finance.

Lipscomb posted the most strikeouts by an Auburn pitcher since 2000 with his 91 on the season. He was also named to the 2015 All-SEC second team.

Lipscomb is the 10th Academic All-American in Auburn baseball history. The most recent selection was Ben Jones in 2008.

### **SEC SWEEPS NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR HONORS**

Florida catcher/designated hitter **JJ Schwarz** and LSU right-hander **Alex Lange** were named the 2015 National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association National Freshman Hitter and Pitcher of the Year recipients, as announced by the organization.

### **UNPRECEDENTED EXPOSURE**

- SEC baseball teams have received unprecedented exposure beginning in the 2015 season with the SEC Network. The network has quadrupled SEC baseball's coverage over last year's nationally televised schedule.
- More than 80 SEC baseball games will air on the SEC Network this season as part of the more than 100 that will air on the ESPN family of networks.
- In addition to those games, more than 350 matchups will be digitally exclusive SEC Network + events available on SECNetwork.com and WatchESPN.
- SEC Network and ESPN2 concluded the regular season with comprehensive coverage of the SEC Baseball Tournament, marking the first time the entire tournament has aired on national television.

### **SEC BASEBALL VIDEO REPLAY**

- The Baseball Rules Committee, working in conjunction with the NCAA Division I Baseball Committee, has approved the use of the experimental video replay rule in regular season games in addition to conference tournament games.
- In addition, the SEC Athletics Directors have approved the use of the experimental video replay rule for SEC regular season games and the SEC Baseball Tournament.

### **SEC AMONG NATION'S BEST IN ATTENDANCE**

- The SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the past 15 seasons and 20 of the last 26 years.
- The SEC has topped the one-million mark in total fan attendance for 12 consecutive years.
- At the conclusion of the season, the top-five spots on the national average attendance charts are SEC teams, with each of those five programs averaging better than 7,300 fans per game.
- Ten SEC teams ranked among the nation's top-25 in average attendance, with each of those 10 programs averaging better than 2,700 fans per game.
- Seven of the top nine spots on the national total attendance charts were SEC teams. Those seven programs combined for more than 1.7 million total fans in attendance during a combined 247 total games this season.
- The national attendance rankings for college baseball are updated each Monday.



## 2015 SEC BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

MAY 19-24, 2015 | HOOVER METROPOLITAN STADIUM | HOOVER, ALA.

Florida hit early and hit often against defending National Champion Vanderbilt, beating the Commodores 7-3 to take home the 2015 SEC Championship. The Gators took the lead in the second pitch of the first inning and never gave the lead away, out-hitting Vanderbilt 14-6. The Gators' first batter, Harrison Bader, homered to left field on his second pitch. Four batters later, Buddy Reed scored on a Peter Alonso single to close out the opening inning.

Vanderbilt answered on a wild pitch by Eric Hanhold in the bottom of the first, but Florida increased the lead to two more in the top of the second inning. Runs came by Reed's double to left field, which let Bader cross home and off a Josh Tobias infield single, on which Reed scored. The No. 4 Gators led the No. 1 Commodores 4-1 by the end of the second inning.

After a brief weather delay, Florida came out in the third with a single run by Jeremy Vasquez's single to left field as JJ Schwarz got the run. Vanderbilt also scored a single run in the bottom of the third on a Rhett Wiseman single that allowed a run by Karl Ellison.

With the score at 5-2, inclement weather in the Hoover, Ala., area returned rapidly at the end of third inning. The game was delayed for two hours and 14 minutes before teams returned to the field.

In the first inning back, the Gators notched two more runs on a Vasquez infield single, scoring Alonso and another on the following pitch as Mike Rivera scored on a wild pitch by Ben Bowden.

Both teams were held scoreless after the fifth inning.

Florida head coach Kevin O'Sullivan attributed the Gators' depth to their tournament success.

"I think we have some depth," O'Sullivan said. "I was really please with how Danny through the ball. I think the 5th inning really may have been the turning point. I think he had to go through the 2-3-4 parts of the order and locate his fastball on both sides. It was just an outstanding effort by a lot of guys."

The win is Florida's seventh SEC Baseball Tournament championship and first since 2011.

Florida improves to 44-16 on the year going into the NCAA College Baseball Regionals. Gator pitcher Danny Young took the win, improving to 4-2 in 2015. The Commodores fall to 42-18 and Ryan Johnson took the loss, moving to 5-1 on the year.

## 2015 SEC NATIONAL POST-SEASON AWARDS

## 2015 SEC BASEBALL LEGENDS PRESENTED BY AT&T

Featuring former standouts from Southeastern Conference member institutions, the SEC Baseball Legends Presented by AT&T were honored at the 2015 SEC Baseball Tournament May 19-24 at the Hoover Met in Hoover, Ala.

The 2015 class featured **Andy Phillips**, Alabama; **David Eckstein**, Florida; **Mark Johnson**, Texas A&M; and **Larry Schmittou**, Vanderbilt.

### **ANDY PHILLIPS – Alabama, Infield: 1996-1999**

Phillips is one of the most decorated players in the history of Alabama baseball. A member of coach Jim Wells' first signing class, Phillips rewrote the Alabama record books and in the process took the Crimson Tide baseball program to new heights with three trips to the College World Series in his four-year career. That impact was not limited to the Crimson Tide baseball family, as his talents were recognized nationally by writers, broadcasters and professional scouts. A consensus All-America selection as a senior, Phillips was named the 1999 National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association District III Player of the Year and finished runner up to Baylor's Jason Jennings for the 1999 Dick Howser Trophy, presented by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association to the best player in college baseball. Florida State's Marshall McDougall, Cal State Fullerton's Spencer Oborn and Rice's Mario Ramos also were finalists for the Howser Trophy, named for the former Florida State infielder and Kansas City Royals manager. Phillips also was named first team All-American by the NCBWA as well as being a member of the 1999 NCBWA Super All-American squad. In addition to the NCBWA honors, Phillips was named first team All-American by College Baseball Insider and was a third team All-America selection by Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball and the American Baseball Coaches Association. The Demopolis, Ala., native wrapped up his Alabama career as the school record-holder in eight career statistical categories, including most games played (244), games started (224), at-bats (905), runs scored (222), total hits (322), home runs (61), RBI (224) and total bases (590). He also ranked second in career doubles (63) and triples (11), and was third in assists (537) and 10th in walks (86). As a senior in 1999, Phillips set the standard of excellence for Crimson Tide baseball. He played in 64 games and batted .398 (103-for-259) with 22 home runs and 66 RBI. He added 71 runs scored, 22 doubles, 30 walks and 16 stolen bases for an Alabama team that captured the SEC Tournament Championship and finished third at the College World Series. Phillips also set Alabama single-season records for total bases (203) and set records for most home runs (22) and RBI (66) by a shortstop at Alabama. The former Tide shortstop also set the SEC record with a 36-game hitting streak during his final season at Alabama, breaking the old standard of 33 games set by LSU second baseman Todd Walker (1993). During his record-setting hitting streak, Phillips batted .407 (66-for-162) with 17 home runs and 45 RBI. In 1998, Phillips was named the Sporting News National Player of the Week (April 1, 1998), after hitting .500 (8-of-16) with six runs scored, three home runs and 11 RBI in wins over Southern Mississippi and Mississippi State. Phillips was just as successful off the field, earning his degree from Alabama in 1999, while being an active member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and is an accomplished singer. Twice during his career, Phillips sang the National Anthem prior to a Crimson Tide home game at Sewell-Thomas Stadium. A three-time All-SEC selection, Phillips also was named to the 1999 SEC Good Works Team for his many hours of community service. Following an 11-year professional baseball career, which included five seasons in Major League Baseball, Phillips returned to Alabama as the hitting and infield coach, beginning with the 2011 season. His MLB debut came in 2004 for the New York Yankees and he homered on the first pitch he saw as a Major League player. Phillips played for the Yankees from 2004-07, before playing his final season in the majors with the Cincinnati Reds in 2008. Prior to returning to Alabama, he played two seasons in the Nippon Professional League in Japan.

### **DAVID ECKSTEIN – Florida; Infield: 1994-97**

While attending Florida, David Eckstein became the only two-time Academic All-American in Gator baseball history (1996, 1997) and earned first-team All-America recognition in 1996 and third-team honors in 1997 from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association (NCBWA). A two-time All-Southeastern Conference selection (1995, 1996) and three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll (1995-97) recipient, he finished his career among the UF career top 10 in 11 categories. Eckstein was a key component of the 1996 Florida squad that captured the SEC's Eastern Division and regular-season titles on its way to the NCAA East Regional championship and a berth at the NCAA College World Series, where the Gators

finished third. He sported a .338 batting average that year with 60 RBI and nine home runs and set single-season school records for hits (102, since broken) and at bats (302, still stands). Eckstein hit for the cycle against Georgia State on Feb. 10, the first UF player to turn the trick since 1984, and also tied the previous high-water mark of nine RBI in that outing. He established a school record with four doubles versus Bethune-Cookman on April 10 and swiped four bases in a 12-9 victory over NC State during the East Regional. Over his four years donning the Orange and Blue, Eckstein played in 199 games and made 190 starts. His career average was .340 and he still ranks among the top 10 in fielding assists (675, first), double plays (142, tied for third), hits (276, fourth), stolen bases (93, second), hit by pitches (41, third), runs scored (222, third), doubles (51, tied for sixth) at bats (812, tied for eighth), total bases (412, ninth), and triples (8, tied for 10th). In addition, he led off the first inning with a homer eight times in his collegiate career. The Gators made three NCAA Tournament appearances during Eckstein's tenure. Eckstein was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 19th round of the 1997 amateur draft, and selected off waivers by the Anaheim Angels in August 2000. In 2002 as a member of the Angels he led the major leagues with three grand slams. At the end of the 2004 season, Eckstein was traded to the St. Louis Cardinals where he was named to the 2005 and 2006 National League All-Star teams and earned MVP honors in the 2006 World Series. He joined Toronto as a free agent before the 2008 season and also played with Arizona and San Diego before retiring in 2012.

### **MARK JOHNSON – Texas A&M; Coach: 1984-2005**

Johnson is the all-time winningest baseball coach in Texas A&M history and served as the Aggies' head coach from 1985 through 2005 compiling a record of 876-431-3 (.670) in Aggieland. Johnson came to Texas A&M and served as Coach Tom Chandler's top assistant in 1983 and 1984. Johnson led the Aggies to the College World Series in 1993 and 1999, won five conference championships, reached the NCAA playoffs 13 years and advanced to the regional championship 10 times. He was named the National Coach of the Year in 1993 by The Sporting News, coached the USA Baseball team in 1999, named a six-time conference Coach of the Year and coached 11 first-team All-Americans and 61 All-Conference selections. A member of the American Baseball Coaches Association's Hall of Fame (2001), Texas Baseball Hall of Fame (2002), FCA Baseball Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award in 2007 and inaugural recipient of the ABCA "Ethics in Coaching" Award in 2008. Johnson would go on to serve as the Sam Houston State baseball head coach from 2007-11 and led the Bearkats to three straight Southland Conference championships and to NCAA post-season play in 2007-08-09 and eclipsed the 1,000 victory plateau before retiring at the conclusion of the 2011 season. Johnson and his wife, Linda, currently call College Station home within easy driving distance of grandchildren.

### **LARRY SCHMITTOU - Vanderbilt; Coach: 1968-78**

Schmittou changed the mindset about Vanderbilt baseball in Music City during his 11 seasons as head coach of the Commodores. He inherited a program that had won only 13 games in the three years prior to his arrival in 1968 and he immediately began giving Vanderbilt fans more to cheer about. His teams won eight games in 1969, 12 in 1970 and just three years into his tenure, the Commodores were SEC East champions with an 11-5 SEC worksheet, 34-19 overall. Schmittou's team would go on to win four consecutive SEC division championships and the 1973 and 1974 teams also won the Southeastern Conference titles. He earned SEC Coach of the Year honors in each championship season. Through 11 years of coaching, Schmittou led his teams to a 306-252-1 (.548) overall record and a 98-98 (.500) SEC record. He coached 20 All-SEC performers, eight all-south regional honorees and seven academic all-conference players. Twenty-one of Schmittou's players would play professionally. During his collegiate coaching tenure, the Commodores won more games than any other SEC school and Vanderbilt was one of only two schools to win four division titles. From 1978 to 1996, he owned several minor league baseball teams, beginning with the Nashville Sounds. He served as the Vice President of Marketing for the Texas Rangers Major League Baseball club from 1983 to 1986. In 2006, Schmittou was elected to the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. He was awarded the Fred Russell Lifetime Achievement Award by the Nashville Sports Council in 2011. Prior to arriving at Vanderbilt, Schmittou was a highly successful sandlot coach in Nashville, winning 500 games, 20 city championships, eight state championships, and made six appearances at national finals. He resides in Brentwood, Tenn.

## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

### ALABAMA

The Alabama Crimson Tide reached the SEC Baseball Tournament for the 32nd time in program history thanks to a 1-0, shutout win of seventh-ranked Vanderbilt to close out the season. The Tide would wrap up the tournament with a pair of wins in four contests before falling to Vanderbilt in the quarterfinal round. Sophomore Geoffrey Bramblett led the Alabama baseball team to a 6-1 win over Ole Miss in the opening round of the 2015 SEC Tournament on Tuesday morning. The Crimson Tide starter tossed his second career complete game in as many chances during the postseason. In just his second postseason start, Bramblett went the distance once again. Despite allowing a season-high tying nine hits, the Rebels could not string them together for more than one run by day's end. The Crimson Tide starter recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts and did not allow a free pass in the start for the second time this season. The pitching effort was matched by a clutch hitting effort from the Crimson Tide bats. By day's end, the offense collected 11 total hits, nine of which came with two outs. Alabama was led by multi-hit efforts from Casey Hughston, Mikey White and J.C. Wilhite. Hughston knocked a double while collecting a team-high two RBI by day's end. Alabama's rally in the ninth came up just short as the Crimson Tide fell to Texas A&M, 4-3, in the second round of the 2015 SEC Tournament. Following an eighth inning that saw the Aggies score one for the lead, the Crimson Tide could not rally for the clutch hit with runners on in the ninth. Alabama took an early, 3-0, lead with two in the second and one in the third, but the Aggies would answer with a three-spot in the bottom half of the third frame. The two teams went scoreless until the bottom of the eighth when TAMU would knock a one-out single up the middle to bring across the go-ahead run and send the game to the final frame with the Crimson Tide trailing, 4-3. In the ninth, Cody Henry drew a one-out walk to start the comeback effort for Alabama and was replaced by pinch-runner Daniel Cucjen. J.C. Wilhite came to the plate and singled through the right side to give the Tide runners on first and second with one down. In the next at-bat, Will Haynie knocked a single to left to put the runners in motion. The deep single allowed Cucjen to try to score for the game-tying run, but an accurate throw from the Aggie left fielder cut down the runner at home. Still with two on, Riley Colburn was hit by a pitch to load the bases, but Chandler Avant would fly out to center to end the contest. Will Haynie's solo home run in the seventh inning broke the tie, lifting Alabama baseball to the 4-3 win over Missouri inside the Hoover Met on Thursday morning in the Crimson Tide's third game of the tournament. Senior Taylor Guilbeau collected his third win of the season and his first against an SEC foe with a 7.0 inning, three-run performance. The left-hander tossed 104 pitches and struck out four by day's end. Fellow senior Jay Shaw tossed a 1-2-3 inning in the eighth and sophomore Thomas Burrows closed out the ninth with two strikeouts to earn his seventh save of the season. Alabama baseball's tournament run ended, as the seventh-ranked Vanderbilt Commodores used an eight-run fourth inning to help secure a 16-1 victory in the quarterfinals of the 2015 Southeastern Conference Baseball Tournament Friday afternoon. The second-seeded Commodores recorded an SEC Tournament record-tying eight doubles and posted 19 hits for 16 total runs in the seven-inning victory. Vanderbilt scored 14 of its 16 with an eight-spot in the fourth and three runs apiece in the fifth and sixth innings en route to advancing to the SEC semifinals.

### ARKANSAS

Arkansas advanced to the College World Series for the eighth time in program history in 2015 ... The Razorbacks have won 40 or more games in six of the last seven seasons ... Arkansas is one of five teams in the country to advance to the NCAA Tournament each of the last 14 years ... The Razorbacks are one of 10 teams in the country to advance to at least three of the last seven College World Series, joining Florida, LSU, North Carolina, South Carolina, TCU, Texas, UCLA, Vanderbilt and Virginia ... Arkansas set the school record for fielding percentage in a season in 2015 at .975. The 63 errors committed was the fewest since making 60 during

the 1978 season ... The 53 home runs hit were the most in a season since hitting a school-record 92 in 2010 ... Arkansas finished No. 2 in the country average attendance for the third straight year with 8,290 fans per game. The Razorbacks posted school records in actual attendance and tickets sold for a single game ... Dave Van Horn made his sixth career appearance in the College World Series, more than any other head coach in the SEC ... In his 13 seasons at Arkansas, Van Horn has led the Razorbacks to four College World Series appearances, five Super Regionals and 13 NCAA Tournament berths ... The skipper eclipsed the 500-win mark at Arkansas on April 5 against Auburn and has a total of 524 wins, averaging more than 40 wins per season ... Sophomore Andrew Benintendi became the most recognized player in program history in 2015, winning four National Player of the Year honors, including the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy ... He led the nation with 20 home runs and became the first NCAA Division I player in seven years to hit 20 home runs and steal 20 bases in a season ... Benintendi became the third player in SEC history to lead the league in home runs and batting average ... He was drafted seventh overall by the Boston Red Sox, becoming the third highest draft pick in school history behind Jeff King (No. 1 in 1986) and Kevin McReynolds (No. 6 in 1981) ... Zach Jackson's nine saves on the year were the seventh-most in a single season in program history, while his current 2.28 career ERA is the sixth-lowest among pitchers with over 100.0 innings of work ... Bobby Wernes recorded seven triples in 2015, the most by a Razorback since Kirk McConnell's eight in 2002 ... Keaton McKinney set the freshman school record with 18 starts on the mound this season ... Michael Bernal is tied for 10th in school history with 28 career hit by pitches ... Arkansas had four players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft, as Andrew Benintendi went seventh overall to the Boston Red Sox, Trey Killian went in the ninth round to the Colorado Rockies, Bobby Wernes went in the 30th round to the Houston Astros and Tyler Spoon went in the 35th round to the Boston Red Sox ... The Razorbacks have had 21 players drafted in the last the years ... Arkansas ended the year as a consensus top 15 team and finished as high as No. 7 in the Collegiate Baseball Top 25 poll.

### AUBURN

Auburn lost its second one-run game to College of Charleston, falling 3-2 to the Cougars Sunday ... The loss eliminated Auburn from the Tallahassee Regional ... The Tigers finish the season with a record of 36-26 ... All three games that Auburn played in the regional were decided by a single run ... Five of six games played in Tallahassee were one-run contests ... The close games in the regional continued a trend for the season for Auburn as 26 of the Tigers' 62 games were decided by one or two runs ... Auburn finished 14-12 in those games ... Auburn is now 40-31 all-time in NCAA Regional play ... Head coach Sunny Golloway led the Tigers to the postseason in just his second year at the helm of the program ... He is now earned postseason bids in 15 of his last 17 seasons as a head coach ... His record all-time in NCAA postseason play is 29-33 ... Auburn's 36 wins this season are the most for the Tigers since winning 43 games in 2010 and the second-most since 2001 ... Auburn's pitching staff posted a 2.20 ERA in the regional and finished with a 3.42 mark for the season, the Tigers' third-best mark since 1989 ... The Tigers' staff finished with 465 strikeouts this season, which is ninth most in program history ... With two stolen bases in the season finale, including the first of the season and second career steal for sophomore first baseman Daniel Robert, Auburn finishes the season with 62 steals ... The Tigers racked up 39 stolen bases in the final 26 games after stealing just 23 bases in the first 36 games ... Auburn finished the season with 109 doubles, which is the most for the Tigers since collecting 113 two-baggers in 2012 ... Auburn's 145 extra base hits this season are the most for the Tigers since ending 2012 with 167 ... The Tigers 18 triples this season are the most since hitting 19 in 2012 ... Auburn set a new program record with a .974 fielding percentage ... The old mark was .970 most recently accomplished last season ... Anfernee Grier and Cody Nulph each started all 62 games this season ... Grier started 61 games in center field and one game in right field while Nulph started all

62 games at shortstop ... The win over Mercer was Auburn's first shutout victory in NCAA Regional play since blanking Clemson 15-0 on May 31, 2003 ... Auburn's eight shutouts this season are tied with the 1976 and 1989 teams for the 2nd-most shutouts in program history, only one off the school record set in 1988 ... This is the 17th time in 19 regional appearances all-time that Auburn has won at least one game ... Auburn wins its first 1-0 decision since defeating Samford by the same margin on April 9, 1996 ... Auburn was 21-3 when playing error-free baseball this season and compiled a .986 fielding percentage in its 36 wins with just 19 errors in those games ... Keegan Thompson recorded his second career save and his first since April 11, 2014, at Alabama ... Damon Haecker walked for the 40th time this season in Auburn's victory over Mercer, which is the most by an Auburn player since Karl Amonite walked 41 times in 2005 ... The Friday loss to Charleston was the first extra-inning game in a regional for Auburn since defeating Jacksonville 8-7 in 10 innings on May 25, 2001.

### FLORIDA

In Kevin O'Sullivan's eighth season at the helm, the Gators (52-18) advanced to the NCAA College World Series for the fourth time in six seasons and were one victory shy of the CWS Finals...Florida made the CWS for the ninth time in school history (1988, 1991, 1996, 1998, 2005, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2015)...UF reached the 50-win plateau for the second time in O'Sullivan's tenure and for the fourth time in school history and its 52 wins were the second-highest total for the program (53 in 2011)... The Gators have been a national seed in six of the past seven seasons (No. 8 in 2009, No. 3 in 2010, No. 2 in 2011, No. 1 in 2012, No. 2 in 2014, No. 4 in 2015) – the most national seeds in the country in that span...Florida set a school record with a .984 fielding percentage, the second-best clip in NCAA history...For the first time in school history, the Orange and Blue ended the seasons of Sunshine State rivals Miami and Florida State in NCAA play...The Gators overpowered the Hurricanes twice in Omaha, by scores of 15-3 and 10-2, and swept the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional over the Seminoles, 13-5 and 11-4...Florida made its first appearance at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha since the 2012 campaign and just two players remained from that club: senior left-hander Bobby Poyner and senior third baseman Josh Tobias...The Gators boast the top-five longest homers in TD Ameritrade Park Omaha history, while sophomore first baseman Peter Alonso occupies No. 1 (429 feet vs. Virginia) and No. 2 (421 feet vs. Miami)...UF claimed its fourth Super Regional title in five appearances under Coach O'Sullivan and its first since 2012 with the sweep of the Seminoles...Florida was 12-3 (.800) in the postseason, going 8-2 (.800) in the NCAA Tournament and 4-1 (.800) at the SEC Tournament...The Gators made their 31st NCAA Tournament appearance and swept through the NCAA Gainesville Regional at McKethan Stadium by knocking off Florida A&M (19-0), USF (8-2) and Florida Atlantic (2-1)...Florida brought home its seventh SEC Tournament Championship on May 24 with a 7-3 victory over No. 9 Vanderbilt. It was the squad's first crown since 2011 and they defeated the 2014 national champions three times in four meetings during the season... After dropping a 7-6 decision to No. 24 Arkansas, the Gators reeled off four consecutive wins over Auburn (11-2), No. 24 Arkansas (10-0 in 7 innings), No. 1 LSU (2-1) and No. 9 Vanderbilt (7-3)...The Tigers and Commodores were the top two seeds at the event...Freshman JJ Schwarz, who went 2-for-5 with a run scored versus Vanderbilt, was chosen as the Most Valuable Player of the SEC Tourney after batting .526 (10-for-19) over the five games, with six RBI, five runs and three doubles...He joined Gator winners Rich Bombard (Pitcher, 1982), Brian Reimsnyder (Outfielder, 1988), Herbert Perry (Designated Hitter, 1991), Brian Purvis (Outfielder, 1991) and Daniel Pigott (Outfielder, 2011)...The NCBWA Freshman Hitter of the Year, Schwarz was 28-for-57 (.491) with 23 runs and 19 RBI during the postseason and batted .333 (6-for-18) during the CWS...He set a Gator freshman record with 18 homers, including a school-record four round-trippers versus Stetson on April 7, and led the club with 73 RBI... Junior left fielder Harrison Bader, Schwarz and Tobias each achieved All-American recognition while second baseman Dalton Guthrie, catcher/designated hitter Mike Rivera and Schwarz were Freshman All-Ameri-

cans...Four Gators are playing for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team this summer – LHP A.J. Puk, OF Buddy Reed, Schwarz and RHP Logan Shore.

### GEORGIA

Georgia finished the 2015 season with a 26-28 overall mark and 10-19 in the SEC. Georgia batted .267 with 40 home runs and 63 stolen bases while posting a 3.96 ERA and a .970 fielding percentage. The Bulldog bullpen allowed just one earned run over the final 29.2 innings pitched. Georgia set a school record by holding teams to a .243 batting average, the previous best was .251 in 1973. On May 12th, Georgia combined on a one-hit shutout of rival Ga. Tech at Turner Field in front of the largest crowd to see a college baseball regular season game this year as 18,792 attended the 13th annual Spring Baseball Classic for Kids. The game benefits Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. Senior Jared Walsh pitched the first five innings and allowed one single with a walk and six strikeouts while the bullpen of Mike Mancuso, Bo Tucker, Taylor Hicks and Jared Cheek preserved the shutout. Junior Daniel Nichols went 3-for-4 with a home run and career-high 5 RBI to pace the offense while Walsh who also served as the designated hitter went 2-for-4 with a double and a scored a run. Bulldog sophomore center fielder Stephen Wrenn (.324-8-28) led the team in batting, runs scored, hits, home runs and stolen bases. He reached base safely in 51 of 54 games including the first 38 contests in 2015. He ranks as one of the top defensive centerfielders in the SEC and ended the regular season with the second most stolen bases in the league with 28. Wrenn's 28 stolen bases were the most by Bulldog since a record 31 by Chaz Lytle in 2002. Georgia's top pitcher in 2015 was two-way standout senior co-captain Jared Walsh. He went 5-2 with a 2.60 ERA in 14 appearances including eight starts while batting .306-3-22 in 43 games including 41 starts as either a DH/1B/OF. Walsh's 2.60 ERA was the lowest by a Bulldog pitcher with at least 55 innings in a season since 2004 when Will Startup posted a 2.22 mark. Head coach Scott Stricklin notched his 400th career win in Georgia's series-clinching road victory over Kentucky on May 10th. In 2015, Georgia posted its first SEC road sweep since 2009 when it won three over Tennessee and then followed that up by claiming its first SEC series at South Carolina since 1994. The highlights in non-conference action included winning a series over No. 11 Florida State plus sweeping a two-game set from Clemson for the first time since 2009.

### KENTUCKY

The Kentucky baseball team completed its 2015 season with a school-record tying fourth consecutive berth in the Southeastern Conference Tournament. UK posted a series win at Missouri to conclude the regular season, before suffering an opening-round loss to Auburn, 6-3 in the SEC Tournament to end UK's season. The Wildcats (30-25, 14-15 SEC) finished the year with a school-record three road series wins in the SEC, taking 2-of-3 from No. 1 LSU, No. 5 Florida and Missouri. Kentucky finished with 14 conference wins, its eighth season of 14 league wins, and ranked fourth in the SEC with eight wins over top-25 foes. Sophomore second baseman JaVon Shelby highlighted UK's season as a first-team All-SEC selection, batting .312 with 12 doubles, two triples, nine homers and 44 RBI. Centerfielder Kyle Barrett became the second UK player to lead the SEC in hits, batting .354 with 12 doubles, three triples, one homer and 26 RBI, stealing seven bases. Junior leftfielder Ka'ai Tom finished with a team-leading .375 average with 16 doubles, one triple, five homers and 51 RBI, stealing 15-of-16 bases. First baseman Evan White was named to the All-SEC defensive team and the Freshman All-SEC team. On the mound, UK was paced by a 6-6 record and a 3.48 ERA from Friday starter Zack Brown, who threw three complete games and two shutouts. Junior righty Dustin Beggs finished with a team-leading seven wins, sporting 3.65 ERA in 93.2 innings, striking out 75.



## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

### LSU

LSU was a consensus No. 5 in the final 2015 college baseball polls, marking the Tigers' fifth Top 10 finish in the past eight seasons and their third Top 5 finish in the past seven years ... the 2015 Tigers led the nation with 54 wins, and LSU advanced to the College World Series for the second time in three years and for the 17th time in school history ... LSU captured the SEC regular-season championship for the 16th time in school history and won the SEC Western Division title for the 18th time ... over the past four seasons, LSU has won a nation's-best 204 games, and the Tigers are the only team in the country to earn a National Seed in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments ... LSU coach Paul Mainieri was named the 2015 National Coach of the Year by the NCBWA, and he received the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year Award presented by the College Baseball Foundation ... the National Coach of the Year designation is the fourth for Mainieri during his career; he has received National Coach of the Year recognition two previous times at LSU (2008, 2009) and once at Notre Dame (2000) ... Mainieri was also voted 2015 SEC Coach of the Year, marking the third time he has received the league honor ... eight Tigers were selected in the 2015 Major League Baseball Draft – the second-highest total in school history - including junior shortstop Alex Bregman, who was the No. 2 overall selection in the draft by the Houston Astros ... LSU produced five players that received 2015 All-America recognition including Bregman, freshman pitcher Alex Lange, senior catcher Kade Scivicque, junior first baseman Chris Chinea and junior centerfielder Andrew Stevenson ... Bregman was one of four finalists for the Golden Spikes National Player of the Year Award, and Scivicque was one of three finalists for the Johnny Bench National Catcher of the Year Award ... Scivicque was also voted to the College World Series All-Tournament Team ... Lange was named National Freshman Pitcher of the Year by Collegiate Baseball magazine and by the NCBWA, and he was voted SEC Freshman of the Year by the league coaches ... four former LSU players have been called up to the Major Leagues this season - outfielder Mikie Mahtook (Rays), pitcher Nick Rumbelow (Yankees), pitcher Aaron Nola (Phillies) and pitcher Nick Goody (Yankees) ... 11 former LSU players coached by Paul Mainieri have reached the big leagues, including Mahtook, Rumbelow, Nola, Goody, pitcher Louis Coleman (Royals), pitcher Charlie Furbush (Mariners), pitcher Ryan Verdugo (Royals), infielder DJ LeMahieu (Rockies), pitcher Kevin Gausman (Orioles), pitcher Anthony Ranaudo (Rangers) and infielder Matt Clark (Brewers).

### OLE MISS

Ole Miss saw its season come to an end over the weekend, dropping two games in the Los Angeles Regional of the 2015 NCAA Baseball Championship. The Rebels fell to eventual regional champion Maryland in the opening matchup, 3-1, May 29. In an elimination game 24 hours later, CSU Bakersfield squeaked by Ole Miss, 2-1, May 30. Against Maryland, senior Austin Knight was phenomenal behind the plate, throwing out three base-runners throughout the game. Knight became the first Rebel to catch three runners stealing since Stuart Turner accomplished the feat against Southeast Louisiana, March 6, 2013. He also reached base twice, drawing a walk and getting plunked by a pitch. Ole Miss starting pitcher Christian Trent went 6.1 innings, surrendering three runs on nine hits and three walks. The southpaw also struck out four Terrapins in his outing. Fellow junior Jacob Waguespack tossed 2.2 scoreless innings of relief, striking out two and not allowing a hit. In the setback to CSU Bakersfield, each team tallied seven hits throughout the ballgame. Sophomore Errol Robinson went 3-for-4 with a double to lead Ole Miss. His performance at the plate was the sixth time this season that he recorded at least three hits, a team high. Classmate J.B. Woodman added a pair of hits as well, and senior Sikes Orvis smacked a single in his final game as a Rebel. Redshirt sophomore Brady Bramlett was saddled with the loss although he pitched effectively for seven innings. The right-hander allowed two runs on seven hits, while striking out five and walking just one. Sophomore Wyatt Short pitched a perfect eighth inning, retiring all three batters he faced. Along with Orvis,

four other seniors played their final game in an Ole Miss uniform: Scott Ashford, Austin Knight, Sam Smith and Scott Weathersby. The senior class finished 153 wins over their four-year careers.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE

Mississippi State finished its 2015 season with an overall record of 24-30, including an 8-22 mark inside the Southeastern Conference. The losing record snapped MSU's four-year stretch of making the NCAA and SEC Tournament. The .267 winning percentage in conference play was the second lowest in the modern era (since 1950), while marking the first time since 1975 the Bulldogs recorded just one series win in conference action. State began the season with the fourth-best start in school history (13-0), and was ranked as high as No. 7 nationally in the USA Today Coaches' Poll (March 2). Following the perfect start, MSU ended the spring 11-30. State lost 18 of its final 21 games, the worst 21-game stretch in school history. A big reason for the lack of success was due to the 272 total games missed due to injury, or the equivalent of five total players missing the entire 54-game regular season. As a whole, the team finished the regular season with a .271 batting average (ninth in the SEC). The top three hitters for MSU were all sophomores – outfielder Jacob Robson (.324), outfielder Cody Brown (.309) and infielder Luke Reynolds (.304). Reynolds finished the last 10 games of the regular season as one of the hottest hitters in the conference, going 20-for-40 (.500) with seven doubles. On the mound, the Maroon and White finished with a 4.51 ERA (14th in SEC), its highest total since 2010 (6.90). Three of the top five starting pitchers for MSU were underclassmen, while underclassmen started a total of 248 games on offense. Defensively, John Cohen's ballclub remained one of the top defensive teams in the country, ranking second nationally with 63 double plays and finishing 11th in NCAA in the regular season with a .977 fielding percentage. Since 2012, MSU ranks first in the NCAA with 264 twin killings and fifth with 2,032 strikeouts. ### MISSOURI

Alabama catcher Will Haynie hit a go-ahead solo homer in the bottom of the seventh inning as Mizzou baseball was eliminated from the SEC Tournament with a 4-3 loss on Thursday morning (May 21) at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium. The loss dropped the Tigers to 30-28 on the season. Mizzou struggled down the stretch but much was due to the schedule as nine of the Tigers' final 18 contests came vs. top-10 teams. Eight of those nine games against top-10 teams were played away from home (3 at Vanderbilt, 3 at LSU, 1 at Missouri State 1 vs. Vanderbilt at the SEC Tournament). Mizzou was the only team in the SEC to play five teams that were ranked No. 1 in any of the major polls at any point of the season in 2015 (LSU, Vanderbilt, Florida, Texas A&M, Illinois). Mizzou was one of just two SEC teams to play LSU, Vanderbilt, Florida and Texas A&M in the first nine weeks of conference play. Mizzou freshman outfielder Trey Harris was named to the 2015 SEC All-Tournament Team, as announced by the league on Sunday night. Harris, an SEC All-Freshman honoree earlier this month, led the Tigers with six hits over three games in Hoover, driving in a pair of runs and scoring three more. He also tallied a double in the three games and led the team with a .462 average, earning a spot as one of four outfielders on the All-Tournament Team.

### SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina finished the 2015 season with a 32-25 record and a 13-17 mark in the Southeastern Conference. Senior first baseman Kyle Martin finished the year leading the Gamecocks in all three of the Triple Crown categories. Martin hit .350 (71-for-203) with 14 HR and 56 RBI. He also scored 50 runs, tallied 12 doubles, tripled twice and stole 11 bases. Martin had a .455 on-base percentage and a .635 slugging mark. Martin had 14 multi-RBI games for the season. Martin was a first-team All-SEC selection.



## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

Junior infielder Max Schrock hit .328 (63-for-192) with six HR and 34 RBI. He scored 44 runs, doubled 11 times and tallied two triples. Schrock had a .419 on-base percentage with a .500 slugging mark. He was a second-team All-SEC selection. Junior left-hander Jack Wynkoop went 8-5 with a 3.27 ERA with 16 appearances and 14 starts. Wynkoop pitched a team-high 104.1 innings and struck out 86 batters with just 14 walks. Wynkoop became the 23rd pitcher in school history to reach the 20-win total. Wynkoop currently ranks 17th all-time in career wins with 22 in his three-year career. Senior outfielder Elliott Caldwell set a South Carolina single-season record with eight triples on the year. Caldwell finished up batting .328 (64-for-195) with 34 runs scored and 41 RBI as well as a .426 on-base percentage and .482 slugging percentage. Caldwell had a team-high 22 multi-hit games. South Carolina finished the year with a total attendance mark of 250,057. That total attendance ranks second-highest in the nation. South Carolina was 28-7 on the year when allowing five runs or less. South Carolina was 29-4 on the year with a lead entering the seventh innings. The Gamecocks were 25-7 when allowing less than 10 hits, 14-5 when recording double-digit hits and 19-2 when out-hitting its opponent. South Carolina was 18-13 in games decided by three runs or less. South Carolina was 20-2 on the year when scoring six or more runs.

### TENNESSEE

Tennessee closed out its 2015 campaign with a 24-26 overall record (11-19 SEC), following a 2-1 loss to Arkansas in the single-elimination rounds of the SEC Tournament in Hoover, Ala. Entering the tournament as the No. 12 seed, Tennessee held a 1-1 tie against the No. 5 seed Razorbacks until the ninth inning, when a leadoff hit and walkoff double down the left field line lifted Arkansas to a 2-1 win. With the loss, the Volunteers drop to 25-23 all-time in SEC Tournament play and a 1-2 postseason record in games played against Arkansas. The loss marked the second straight year for the Vols to reach the first round of the SEC Tournament and be eliminated. Tennessee clinched a postseason bid to the SEC Tournament in back-to-back seasons (2014-15) for the first time since 2004-05, after not appearing in the conference tournament from 2008-13. To clinch their postseason berth, the Vols completed their first-ever series sweep over Mississippi State and now own a three-game win streak against the Bulldogs for the first time since March 24, 1969 - May 13, 1970. The feat also marked the Vols' first SEC series sweep since 2012, when the Vols took three games against the Alabama Crimson Tide. Having completed his fourth season at the helm of the Volunteers' Program, Head Coach Dave Serrano reached 100 career wins at Tennessee, now holding a 101-109 (.490) record in games as head coach on Rocky Top. Sophomore second baseman Nick Senzel posted Tennessee's highest average in 2015, hitting .325 with 12 doubles, five triples, four homers and 28 RBI. Two-time All-SEC outfielder Christin Stewart led the Vols' offense in multiple categories, including homers (15), RBI (47), slugging percentage (.633) and on-base percentage (.443). The junior also led the SEC in times hit by a pitch this season (15). Stewart was named First Team All-SEC on May 18, immediately prior to Tennessee's matchup against Arkansas at the SEC Tournament. Stewart became the first Volunteer to be named a First Team All-SEC player in consecutive years since Tennessee Hall of Famer Chris Burke (2000-01) did so following his record-setting campaigns on Rocky Top. Over the course of the season, Tennessee led the league in sacrifice bunts (53) while junior A.J. Simcox used eight sac bunts on the season to secure his first-place spot on the all-time sacrifice bunts list at Tennessee with 34 in his career. Senior righthander Bret Marks emerged as the Vols' leader in the starting rotation, going 4-5 with a 2.92 ERA and 89 strikeouts over 77.0 innings pitched. His strikeouts were sixth-most in the league and his .202 opposing batters average ranked third in the SEC.

### TEXAS A&M

The Aggies completed the fifth 50-win campaign in school history. Texas A&M logged the third-best winning percentage in school history (.781 - 50-14). Blake Allemand ended his career as the Aggies' all-time leader in games started (225) and ranked 10th with 241 hits. Matt Kent was the hero of the postseason going 3-0 with a 0.59 ERA in four starts in the SEC Tournament and NCAA Championship, allowing just two runs on 21 hits and six walks while striking out 26 in 30.2 innings. The Aggies claimed their seventh NCAA Regional title.

### VANDERBILT

The Commodores posted the team's second consecutive 50-win season going 51-21 for the team's fourth 50-win season in the last five years, the most in the nation. Vanderbilt finished as the national runner-up after losing 4-2 to Virginia in the third game of the CWS finals. Virginia rallied for three runs in the sixth inning to force a third and decisive game in the championship series with a 3-0 win. Philip Pfeifer was the tough-luck loser allowing three unearned runs. The Commodores beat Virginia 5-1 in the first game of the championship series behind a strong Carson Fulmer start. The junior won his 14th game to match a school record with 7.2 scoreless innings. Vanderbilt returned to the CWS championship series with a 7-1 win over TCU Friday night. Bryan Reynolds drove in two runs with three hits in Walker Buehler's win. The Commodores advanced at the CWS thanks to Zander Wiel's solo homer in a 1-0 win over TCU Tuesday night. Philip Pfeifer picked up the win with seven scoreless innings. Vanderbilt rallied for three runs in the ninth to stun Cal State Fullerton 4-3 in a suspended game Monday afternoon. Jeren Kendall's walk-off, two-run homer is the first walk-off homer in TD Ameritrade Park history. The Commodores advanced to the College World Series with a 4-2 win at Illinois on Monday. Dansby Swanson hit his team-best 15th homer and Philip Pfeifer turned in 6.2 solid innings in the win. Vanderbilt claimed the Super Regional opener 13-0 at Illinois Saturday night. The Commodores scored early and often in a 21-0 NCAA Regional clinching win over Radford. Zander Wiel drove in a career-best six runs with four hits, including his 13th homer. Dansby Swanson hit a two-run homer in the ninth inning to help beat Indiana 6-4 on Saturday night in the NCAA Regional. Vanderbilt opened the NCAA Tournament with a 9-1 win over Lipscomb. Vanderbilt won the SEC East division and finished second overall in the league going 20-10.

### 2015 SEC ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Year after year, the SEC continues to be the benchmark in paid college baseball attendance. The SEC and its member schools own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 16 seasons in a row, and 21 of the last 27 years. In 2007, the SEC drew nearly 1.7 million and averaged for 4,000 per game for first time in history. New records were once again set in 2011 as the league drew over two million for the first time ever, as well as nearly 5,000 per game. An NCAA-record 2,319,937 total fans attended regular-season games in the SEC in 2014. The 2015 season marked the 12th year in a row the SEC has topped the one million mark in attendance, leading the nation once again in that category by a wide margin.
