SEC Women's Basketball Tournament



Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012), Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010, 2013, 2014).

SEC Tournament Tie-Breaker Procedures

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive a "bye" on the first and second days of the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

She capped the week scoring 16.0 ppg to earn all-tournament honors in Las Vegas. Vivians rates third in the SEC with 16.3 ppg. TEAM NOTES: The reigning SEC regular-season champion, South Carolina is one of a handful of teams in the nation who enter 2015 undefeated. The Gamecocks' 12-0 record marks the best opening to a season in school history and is one victory shy of the longest win streak in school history. South Carolina has shown that it can win in a variety of ways this season – by single digits three times and by 20 or more points nine times, scoring fewer than 80 points five times and 80 or more seven times, shooting under 33.3 percent from 3-point range five times and better than that seven times, and scoring at least half its total points in the paint five times and more than half its total in the paint seven times. With the offense has varied in location and volume, the defense has been steady and especially staunch in the last five games, during which the Gamecocks have not allowed an opponent to score more than 50 points. For the season, South Carolina is among the nation's top five stingiest defenses, allowing just 47.6 points per game, while also ranking among the nation's top 10 in field goal percentage, rebounding margin, assists per game and assist-to-turnover ratio. The Gamecocks open conference play with a split opening weekend beginning at home on Friday against Auburn then traveling to LSU for Sunday action.
