SEC Women's Basketball Tournament



On Feb. 7, 1980, the first SEC women's basketball tournament began play. It ended four days later with Tennessee defeating Ole Miss for the title. Fast forward 36 years later and the SEC Tournament is still enjoying success and increased popularity.

Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012), Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015), Greenville, S.C. (2005), Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010, 2013, 2014) and Jacksonville, Fla. (2015).

The winner of the 13-game tournament will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds and conference champion will be determined by the 16-game regular-season SEC schedule.

The 2016 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament will once again enjoy live television coverage. The SEC Network will televise all first, second and third round games. The semifinals will be aired on ESPNU for the fifth consecutive year, while the championship game will be televised on ESPN.

All games also will be available through WatchESPN, accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app, and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 or Xbox One to fans who receive their video subscription from an affiliated provider.

Public tickets for this year's event went on sale October 15 and can be purchased through the SEC website.

TOURNAMENT TIE-BREAKER PROCEDURE

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive a "bye" on the first and second days of the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

Team Notes: With hopes of capping off a December to remember, the Vanderbilt women are in New York this week for the Fordham Holiday Classic. The surging Commodores will carry an eight-game winning streak -- including a 4-0 mark in December -- into the tournament. VU's winning streak has lasted well over a month, starting with a win over Presbyterian on Nov. 23. Vanderbilt is averaging 72 points per game during the streak, while the VU defense has limited opponents to 59 points or less in six of the eight games, including three games in which they limited their opponents to 39 points or less. The eight-game streak is Vanderbilt's longest since the 2013-14 season, when the Commodores won nine straight (Nov. 24-Jan. 2). In VU's most recent game, on Dec. 21, Kristen Gaffney converted two free throws with just under a minute remaining and Christa Reed made two more with nine seconds left to help the Commodores squeak past UT Martin 64-61 and extend their winning streak to eight games. Reed finished with a game-high 20 points and Rachel Bell added 10 or the Commodores (9-2), who survived their first down-to-the wire finish in almost a month, dating back to a 62-59 win over Ohio on Nov. 28.
