**SEC AT THE 2015 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Arkansas' Dominique Scott finished third overall at the 2015 NCAA Cross Country Championships, giving the senior her third All-America honors.

The Razorback men finished sixth as a team and the women ninth. Mississippi State women finished 17th overall, while the Vanderbilt women came in 19th as a team. The Ole Miss men finished 30th overall.

The top individual finisher for the SEC men was Arkansas sophomore Jack Bruce, finishing the men's 10K in 30:15.3. SEC Champion Dominique Scott finished with a time of 19:40.9. NCAA Champion Molly Seidel from Notre Dame finished in 19:28.6. Tennessee's Chelsea Blaase finished 14th overall with a time of 20:07.2. Vanderbilt freshman Caroline Pietrzyk finished 30th.

For the Arkansas women, it took the effort of the entire team to pull off the successful performance. Arkansas' top five was rounded out by Devin Clark (48th), Regan Ward (103rd), Kelsey Schrader (111th) and Kaitlin Flattmann (127th). One of the best freshman in the field, Clark missed out on All-America honors by a mere eight spots.

The Razorback men's sixth-place finish was their best performance since 2006 when they placed fifth at the championships in Terre Haute, Ind.

**OLE MISS MEN, ARKANSAS WOMEN PICKED TO WIN SEC TITLES**

The University of Mississippi men and the University of Arkansas women have been predicted to claim the 2015 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championships, as decided by a vote of the league's head coaches. The SEC released its 2015 SEC Cross Country Preseason Coaches Poll.

Points for the men's poll were awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12 basis, while the women's poll was awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13 basis. Coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

The Ole Miss men, for the first time in the program's history, were predicted to win the 2015 SEC Cross Country Championship. The Rebels placed second at the 2014 SEC Championship, tying the 1968 Ole Miss team for the best finish in school history. The Rebels earned seven first-place votes, while Arkansas, which has won 22 of the last 24 SEC Cross Country Championships and five consecutive, garnered six first-place votes.

The Arkansas women, who have won two consecutive SEC Cross Country Championships, were selected to win the 2015 SEC Cross Country Championship. The Razorbacks, who received 12 first-place votes, finished fifth at the 2014 NCAA Championship. Florida and Vanderbilt each earned one first-place vote.

**SEC IN THE NCAA: CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY**

- The SEC has won eight NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, with Arkansas claiming seven and Tennessee winning one. The last SEC NCAA Championship came in 2000, with Arkansas winning its third consecutive.
- The SEC has won one NCAA Women's Cross Country Championship, with Kentucky holding the only title, which the Wildcats won in 1988.
- The SEC boasts two NCAA Cross Country individual titles, as Godfrey Siamusiye of Arkansas won back-to-back national crowns in 1995 and 1996.
- No SEC woman has ever claimed an NCAA Cross Country individual championship. Four SEC women have finished as the NCAA runner-up: Shelly Steely, Florida (1984); Valerie McGovern, Kentucky (1989); Deena Drossin, Arkansas (1992) and Amy Yoder, Arkansas (1999).

**ABOUT THE SEC**

• Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has directed and organized inter-scholastic athletic competitions, conducted tournaments and prescribed eligibility rules for student-athletes. The Conference also facilitates and assists its member institutions in maintaining intercollegiate athletic programs compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.

• The Southeastern Conference crowns champions in 21 sports - 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

• In the fall of 2012, the University of Missouri and Texas A&M University became the 13th and 14th members of the Southeastern Conference. It marked the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 and the second-ever increase for the league since its founding in 1933.

• The Southeastern Conference won six national championships in 2014-15: Equestrian (South Carolina); Men's Golf (LSU); Gymnastics (Florida); Softball (Florida); Women's Tennis (Vanderbilt) and Women's Indoor Track and Field (Arkansas).

The SEC also had national runners-up in six sports: Baseball (Vanderbilt); Equestrian (Georgia); Women's Swimming and Diving (Georgia); Men's Indoor Track and Field (Florida); Men's Outdoor Track and Field (Florida) and Women's Outdoor Track and Field (Kentucky).

• In 2014-15, 178 SEC teams advanced to NCAA postseason competition and 53 SEC student-athletes garnered individual national championships.

• More than 3,300 student-athletes earned recognition on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2014-15.

• Since 2000, the SEC has won 101 team national championships for an average of more than six per year.

## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

**ALABAMA**

Senior Katelyn Greenleaf and junior Antibahs Kosgei closed out the 2015 cross country season by competing at the NCAA Cross Country Championships on Saturday, Nov. 21, at the E.P. 'Tom' Sawyer State Park in Louisville, Ky. The women's 6-kilometer race was run first. Greenleaf sat in 115th (6:49.50) at the 2k mark, but slowly worked her way up the standings. She eventually crossed the finish line in a time of 20:37.50 to place 63rd overall. Notre Dame's Molly Seidel (19:28.60) won the individual title while the New Mexico Lobos claimed the team championship with 49 points. In the men's 10-kilometer race, Kosgei checked in at 40th (5:46.90) at the 2k mark and continued to hold his own halfway through the race, clocking a 5k time of 15:29.70. Kosgei fell off the pace a bit from there, dropping to 99th (24:29.30) at the 8k mark. He would cross the finish line in 102nd overall, posting a time of 30:59.30. Oregon's Edward Cheserek won the individual crown thanks to a time of 28:45.80, the only runner to finish under 29:00. The Syracuse Orange won the team title with 82 points.

**ARKANSAS**

**Men** – Arkansas men's cross country team capped their season with a sixth-place finish at the 2015 NCAA Cross Country Championships on Saturday afternoon. Sophomore transfer, Jack Bruce was the top finisher for the Razorbacks collecting a top-25 finish to become their sixth different leader through six races. Arkansas has now finished in the top 10 three times in the last six years. The Razorbacks sixth-place finish was their best performance since 2006 when they placed fifth at the championships in Terre Haute, Ind. As the gun sounded to signal the start, Bruce burst out into the open field and positioned himself to attack the course on his terms. Gradually picking off runners through the 5K and 7K marks the Brisbane, Australia native made major moves on the final straight away to place 23rd overall in 30:15.30. Keeping their pack mentality, Gabe Gonzalez and Frankline Tonui remained close together just a few 100 meters behind Bruce. Both upperclassman finished in the top-50 with Tonui placing 40th in 30:29.60 and Gonzalez 48th in 30:31.70. Austen Dalquist and Cale Wallace were the final two of the Razorbacks top-five finishing 89th and 112th respectively. Christian Heymsfield and Alex George completed the seven entries placing 170th and 176th, respectively. Bruce and Tonui earned All-American honors for their top-40 finishes. This is the second time that head coach Chris Bucknam has had two All-Americans in the same season. Dorian Ulrey (11th) and Solomon Haile (17th) last accomplished the feat at the 2010 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

**Women** – Arkansas women's cross country raced to a ninth-place finish at the 2015 NCAA Cross Country Championships. The Razorbacks were led by Dominique Scott who capped her phenomenal career placing third overall to become a three-time All-American. This is the second-consecutive season the Razorbacks have finished among the 10 best programs in the nation within cross country. In windy conditions, Scott was off to a fast start, immediately finding a place with the lead group. The front pack's quick tempo was set by 2015 NCAA outdoor 10K champion, Molly Seidel of Notre Dame. Along with Seidel and Scott, Boise State's Allie Ostrander made her way to the front of the race and the three began to distance themselves from competition. In the final 1,000 meters Scott dug deep and kicked to finish line to place third and help secure the Razorbacks a spot in the top-10. It took the effort of the entire team to pull off the successful performance. Arkansas' top five was rounded out by Devin Clark (48th), Regan Ward (103rd), Kelsey Schrader (111th) and Kaitlin Flattmann (127th). One of the best freshman in the field, Clark missed out on All-America honors by a mere eight spots. Redshirt freshman Sydney Brown was the sixth finisher for Arkansas placing 178th in 21:22.40 while Valerie Reina completed the team as the seventh finisher placing 217th in 21:54.80.

**AUBURN**

Auburn freshman Brenda Kigen finished 54th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships on Saturday at the Tom Sawyer State Park in Louisville, Ky. Kigen clocked a 20:33.2 on the 6k course and finished in the top-10 among freshman in the field of 254. Kigen's finish is the highest by a female Tiger since Holly Knight placed 11th in 2008. The Eldoret, Kenya native earned All-SEC honors this season after finishing fourth at the SEC Championships, before earning All-Region honors following her fifth

place performance at the NCAA South Regional.

**FLORIDA**

Florida's two individual competitors at the NCAA Cross Country Championship—redshirt seniors Eddie Garcia and Jimmy Clark—capped their remarkably consistent five-year careers with solid showings. Garcia, one of five Gators in program history to finish three NCAA Championship races, clocked a time of 30:51.0 to take 86th place in the men's 10k race. It was the ninth-fastest 10k time by a UF runner at the NCAA Championship. Prior to Saturday (Nov. 21) afternoon, Garcia had not finished higher than 150th at the NCAA Championship. Garcia departs as one of 11 three-time USTFCCCA All-South Region honorees in UF history, as well as a two-time second-team All-SEC member. Clark, who joined Jeremy Criscione (2005-08) as the only other Gator in program history to qualify for and finish four NCAA Championship meets, crossed in 31:11.5. The St. Johns, Fla. native finished 126th overall, his second-best performance on the biggest national stage. Clark ends his career as the only four-time USTFCCCA All-South Region honoree and three-time first-team All-SEC honoree in program history, and tied for the sixth-most top-10 finishes (14) in UF history.

**GEORGIA**

**Men** – The Bulldogs closed out their 2015 campaign by finishing fourth (127 points) at the NCAA South Regional Cross Country Championships in Tuscaloosa, Ala., which represented a five-place improvement from 2014. As he had done the two meets before, senior Zack Sims led the Bulldogs with an eighth-place finish (30:56.65) for All-Region honors. Sims had the best finish for Georgia at the meet since Luke Baker and Brandon Lord went fourth and seventh, respectively, in 2013. He missed being an at-large individual qualifier for the NCAA Championships by less than two seconds. Sophomore Bryan Kamau also earned All-Region honors after finishing second for the Bulldogs with a 17th-place finish (21:22.04). An All-Region performer in 2014, senior Steven Spevacek wrapped up his career with a 26th-place finish (31:43.07) to be the third Georgia runner across the line at the Harry Pritchett Running Park. Similar to Sims, junior Sid Vaughn redshirted the 2014 season and returned this year to take 33rd at the South Regionals after clocking a 31:51.65. The Bulldogs' fifth and final scorer was junior Morgan Malanoski, who completed the course in 32:08.58 for 44th place. Georgia's distance runners will return to action during the 2016 indoor and outdoor track seasons.

**Women** – The Lady Bulldogs ran in their final meet of the year and were 10th (364 points) at the NCAA South Regionals. Junior Victoria Coppage ran in just her second meet of the year and led the team with a 53rd-place finish (21:35.94) in the women's 6k. She opened her season after the SEC Championships where she also finished first for Georgia (48th). Fellow junior Lauren Kelly, who led the Lady Bulldogs once this season, was the team's runner-up on Alabama's course with a 70th-place finish (21:53.62). Redshirt sophomore Morgan Ainslie moved up to the third scoring spot for Georgia after taking 81st with a time of 22:06.51. Debuting at her first NCAA South Regionals, sophomore Allie Castro finished four spots behind Ainslie with an 85th-place finish (22:13.61). Redshirt sophomore Morgan Green rounded out the team's scorers after finishing 92nd with a time of 22:19.25.

**KENTUCKY**

Jacob Thomson used a strong second half to finish 44th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships on his hometown course at EP "Tom" Sawyer Park. Thomson passed 16 runners in the final 2,000 meters of his second 10,000-meter race in eight days. His time of 30:30.50 was 0.9 seconds and four spots behind the coveted 40th-placer. The top-40 finishers earn All-America honors from the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. Thomson, a sophomore transfer, was the first Wildcat to qualify for the NCAA Championships since Cally Macumber in 2013. Luis Orta was the last UK men's team member to qualify for NAAs, in 2012, which was the last time the NCAA Championships were held in Louisville. Orta finished 114th in 30:52.30. Thomson made the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 2013, finishing 214th in 32:30.70.

## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

**LSU**

LSU's cross country teams wrapped up the 2015 season at the NCAA South Central Regional on Friday morning with three runners finishing in the Top 40, including senior Morgan Schuetz's 12th-place finish. LSU raced four athletes, two runners in the men's 10k meet and two runners in the women's 6k meet. With only four runners, the Tigers and Lady Tigers did not post a team score. Schuetz led the way for the LSU cross country teams by clocking a personal-best time of 20:23.5 for 12th place out of 162 runners. Schuetz finished her senior season earning All-Region honors by finishing in the Top 25 individually and improving her time by 1:20 from last season's regional meet when she placed 42nd overall. Freshman Dajour Braxton, the 2015 SEC Men's Freshman Cross Country Runner of the Year, posted another solid performance finishing 28th with a time of 31:13.9. Braxton missed All-Region honors by three spots. Junior Christian Johnson finished shortly behind Braxton with a time of 31:26.3 for 36th place. Braxton and Johnson paced a little over a five-minute mile for their first 10k meet of their careers. Rounding out the 6k meet for the Lady Tigers was freshman Hannah Bourque, placing 108th with a time of 23:01.3.

**OLE MISS**

For the second season in a row, the Ole Miss men's cross country team wrapped up its season at the NCAA Championships. The Rebels finished 30th in the 10K race on Saturday. Sophomore Sean Tobin, who came in at 68th with a time of 30:42.6. Tobin's finish was the fourth-best in program history at the NCAA Championships. The Rebels joined Arkansas and Georgia as the only SEC men's teams in the past five years to earn back-to-back NCAA Championship berths. This season saw the Rebels finish third at the SEC Championships to earn consecutive top-three finishes for the first time since 1968-69. To earn the berth to this year's NCAA Championship, the Rebels finished runner-up at the NCAA South Regional. The five All-Region selections matched the most in program history.

**MISSISSIPPI STATE**

Coming in three spots ahead of prediction, the No. 20 Mississippi State women's cross country team finished 17th at its first-ever NCAA Championships appearance. The Maroon and White scored 405 points during the meet with Marta Freitas leading the way in 37th place after clocking a time of 20:26.70. Freitas' Top 40 finish earned her All-American honors becoming the third All-American in program history. Not far behind Freitas was MSU's second runner, junior Rhianwedd Price. Price posted 50th place with a time of 20:32.30. Senior Cornelia Griesche captured the third-place finish for the Bulldogs after recording a time of 21:01.10 to finish 125th overall. Mia Meydrich, sophomore, and Lisa Ziegler, junior, rounded out MSU's Top 5. Meydrich placed 162nd clocking a time of 21:16.20. Running a time of 21:19.50, Ziegler earned 169th in the meet. Also in competition today was junior Ffion Price and freshman Shannon Fair in the sixth and seventh spots. Ffion Price earned 188th with a time of 21:29.80, while Fair recorded a time of 21:48.40 to place 213th, respectively. New Mexico captured the first-place team finish with 49 points, while Molly Seidel from Notre Dame ran a time of 19:28.60 to finish first individually. With the conclusion of the best season in program history, the MSU distance runners will now turn their attention toward the indoor track and field season, which will begin in January.

**MISSOURI**

The Tigers closed out their 2015 cross country campaign on Friday (November 13) at the NCAA Midwest Regional Championships, hosted by the University of Kansas at the historic Rim Rock Farm. Led by an All-Midwest Regional finish from sophomore Karissa Schweizer, the women placed 12th in the team field, with the men coming in at 11th overall. Schweizer closed in 25th overall for her second consecutive All-Midwest honor with a final time of 20:59.10. Not far behind her was junior Teylar Adelsberger in 30th, who clocked her fastest 6k time ever on the cross country course with a final crossing of 21:10.30. Fellow-junior Nicole Mello was next through in 88th overall (22:00.10), followed by freshman Kelli Jackson in 90th (22:02.20) and sophomore Jamie Kempfer rounded out the top five scorers in 145th overall (22:42.50). Junior Dan Roe led the way for the men, moving through the field to close in 42nd overall with a final time of 31:14.70. Fellow-junior Jordan Cook was not far behind in

57th (31:25.90), and was followed closely by sophomore Sheldon Keence in 60th overall (31:29.70). A pair of juniors closed out the top five, with Drew White closing in 85th overall (31:50.50) and Ollie Lockley in 107th (32:15.0).

**SOUTH CAROLINA**

The South Carolina women's cross country program ran at the NCAA Southeast Regional Championship, hosted by the University of Virginia. Junior Mary Reiser was the team's top finisher at 39th overall, and the Gamecocks finished 26th. Reiser sat in 17th place in the field of 238 runners as the group hit the 2,000-meter mark, running a 6:46 split. She fell back to 25th, the cusp of making the all-region team, at the 5,000-meter split before settling at 39th with a time of 21:57.8. It marks the fifth-straight season that Carolina had a top-40 finisher at regionals, and all five have finished in under 22 minutes. Rounding out the team's top three were freshman Alexis Malmborg (154th) and sophomore Monica York (158th). Of the team's six finishers, five were either freshmen or sophomores.

**TENNESSEE**

Tennessee senior Chelsea Blaase finished 14th at the 2015 NCAA Division I Women's Cross Country Championship on Saturday at E.P. Tom Sawyer Park to earn All-America honors for the second-straight year. Blaase ran with the front group for most of the race and finished at 20:07.70. She was in seventh place at the 2K mark at 6:40.70 and battled with the best to the final turn. Blaase, who placed 10th at the 2014 NCAA Championships, joins Brenda Webb (1977, 1978) and Kathy Bryant-Hadler (1980, 1981, 1982) as Tennessee's only multi-year women's cross country All-Americans. Blaase, Webb and Bryant-Hadler are also the only three UT women to post multiple top-15 finishes at nationals. Blaase wraps one of the most impressive Tennessee cross country careers. She posted 13-straight top-10 finishes over a two-year span (2013-15) with 10 top-three finishes and four career wins. Blaase punched her second ticket to the NCAA Championships last week when she won the 2015 NCAA South Regional in Tuscaloosa, Ala. Blaase, who earned 2015 All-America honors in indoor track (5,000m) and outdoor track (10,000m), will be back in action in January when Tennessee opens its 2016 indoor track & field season.

**TEXAS A&M**

**Men** – In the men's race, the Aggies finished third, just missing one of the two automatic team qualifying positions by 16 points. A&M juniors Austin Wells and Cameron Villarreal led the squad in placing 11th and 12th. Wells covered the 10,000-meter distance in 30:24.3 as Villarreal clocked 30:28.2. The Texas A&M men recorded a third-place effort in the region meet for the fifth time since 2002, recording its best score as a third-place team. The Aggies improved from a seventh-place finish the past two seasons. An impressive run from Christian Farris had the Aggie sophomore placing 14th in finishing behind the tandem of Wells and Villarreal as he covered the course in 30:31.7. Alex Riba was the next A&M runner to finish with a 30:56.9 clocking to place 24th. All four were on the All-Region team for a top 25 performance. The fifth finisher for the Aggies was Colin Stoeber as he placed 30th in 31:17.3 and Ryan Teel finished 33rd in 31:24.2 as the sixth A&M runner. A seventh entrant for the Aggies, Juan Uribe, did not finish.

**Women** – An All-American performance had Karis Jochen placing 36th in the NCAA Championships on Saturday amid an overcast day with temperatures in the low 50s on the E.P. Tom Sawyer course. Jochen recorded a time of 20 minutes, 23.9 seconds over the 6,000-meter course. Jochen overcame a delay at the start of the race and put herself back in a good position by the first mile. At the 2,000 meter mark she was in 30th place with a 6:41.8 split. Through the last half of the race Jochen maintained her form with a determination to remain among the top 40 in the field of 254 runners. Jochen earned the sixth All-American honor by an Aggie female, joining a pair teammates from last season – Grace Fletcher and Hillary Montgomery – as well as Melissa Gulli (2000 & 2002) and Andrea Bookout (2000). The time of 20:23.9 by Jochen is the fastest ever by a Texas A&M runner in the national championship race, topping the 20:29.8 recorded by Gulli in 2002.

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

VANDERBILT

Racing in their fifth straight NCAA Championships, the Commodores finished 19th at E.P. Tom Sawyer State Park for their best team finish since 2011. As she has done all season, Pietrzyk led the team, racing to 32nd – the highest individual NCAA finish in school history. She finished fifth among freshmen in the field and became just the second Commodore to earn All-American honors. The race capped off a spectacular season for the Commodores, who entered ranked 19th in the country and on the heels of winning their second straight South Region championship. The top 20 finish at the NCAA Championships marks the program's second-best finish. The 2011 squad finished sixth in the team's first trip to nationals. Pietrzyk finished with a time of 20:21.2 and became Vanderbilt's first All-American since Alexa Rogers finished 39th in 2011. Senior Vanessa Valentine finished second for the Commodores for the second straight race. After finishing eighth at South Region meet, she placed 105th with a time of 20:51.9, moving up 55 spots. The trio of junior Carmen Carlos (148th, 21:11.9), freshman Sara Tsai (167th, 21:17.7) and senior Sara Barron (177th, 21:22.4) then finished 11 seconds apart to lock in the top 20 finish. Sophomore Maddie Criscione (214th, 21:49.5) and redshirt junior Lily Williams (221st, 21:59.0) rounded out the Commodores.
