SEC Gymnastics Fast Facts

• Southeastern Conference teams have won nine of the last 10 NCAA Championships, including four consecutive, and 18 NCAA titles all-time. Three different SEC teams - Alabama, Florida and Georgia - have won NCAA Gymnastics Championships.

• Florida won its second consecutive NCAA Championship in 2014. Four SEC teams advanced to the Super Six at last season's NCAA Championship.

• In 1998, the SEC entered the record books as the only conference ever to sweep the top-three spots at the NCAA meet (Georgia, Florida and Alabama).

• The SEC has placed at least two teams among the top six in 31 of the possible 33 NCAA Championship events. A record five SEC teams advanced to the NCAA Super Six team final in 2009.

- The SEC leads all conferences in NCAA individual titles (97).
- Georgia leads all NCAA schools in individual titles (40).
- SEC student-athletes earned 30 All-America honors in 2014.

• The addition of Missouri to the SEC in July 2012 brought the number of league institutions sponsoring gymnastics to eight. The 2013 SEC Gymnastics Championship featured, for the first time, a two-session final.

Team Notes

The 2015 Southeastern Conference and NCAA Auburn Regional Champion Alabama gymnastics team will compete in the evening session of the NCAA Championships Semifinals Friday, April 17 in the Fort Worth Convention Center Arena starting at 7 p.m. CT. Alabama, which won its ninth SEC title last month, advanced to its 33rd consecutive NCAA Championships on Saturday by winning its NCAA-best 30th regional championship in Auburn, Ala. The Crimson Tide will face defending NCAA co-Champion Oklahoma along with LSU, Auburn, Oregon State and Nebraska in the semifinal round of the NCAA Championships. Defending NCAA co-Champion Florida and past champions Georgia, UCLA and Utah along with Stanford and Michigan compete in the first semifinal session on Friday starting at 1 p.m. Alabama will start the semifinal session on the floor exercise and will then move to the vault before taking its first of two byes. After the bye, the Tide will move to the uneven bars and balance beam before sitting a bye during the last of six rotations. This year marks the seventh in a row that Alabama has competed in semifinal session II. From its semifinal session, Alabama has already faced Oklahoma, LSU and Auburn this season. The Tide has also competed against Florida and Georgia from the afternoon semifinal session. Alabama is a combined 9-2-0 against this year's championship field this season.

Team Notes

The No. 19-ranked University of Arkansas women's gymnastics team overcame a slow start at the NCAA Morgantown Regional, but it wouldn't be enough to advance them to the NCAA Championship Session, as they scored a 196.500 to finish fourth. The Razorbacks started out with a 48.850 on the floor exercise, but recovered from that to post the program's best score on the vault at the NCAA Regional with a 49.375. Arkansas ended the day with a season-best on the balance beam with a 49.150, to post a 196.500. Today's total was the fifth-highest score for Arkansas at the NCAA Regional meet. Sophomore All-American Amanda Wellick led Arkansas' vault rotation, as she got a perfect 10 from one judge on her attempt to score a 9.925. Wellick finished in a tie for fifth at the meet, and extended her streak of 9.9-or-better on the vault to eight-straight meets. Her 9.925 is the third-highest score by an Arkansas gymnast on the vault in NCAA Regional history. The 9.925 was one of two 9.9's during the vault rotation for Arkansas, as junior All-SEC gymnast Heather Elswick scored a 9.9 from the third spot. Elswick's total on the vault is the only eighth 9.9 scored by an Arkansas gymnast at the NCAA Regional and ties her for the fourth-best score on the vault in program history at Regionals. The Razorbacks also got a trio of 9.8plus scores from sophomore Samantha Nelson (9.825) and freshmen Leah MacMoyle (9.850) and Paige Zaziski (9.875). Arkansas collected a season-best 49.150 on the balance beam to end the afternoon. The Razorbacks concluded the rotation with four-straight 9.8-or-better scores, led by junior Sydnie Dillard's 9.875. Dillard's score allowed her to finish in a tie for sixth at the NCAA Regional. Senior Cailee Ellsworth ended her Arkansas career on a high-note, by posting a career-best 9.850 from the anchor slot. Zaziski matched Ellsworth score and Nelson scored a 9.800 to round out the quartet of 9.8-plus scores.

No. 8 Auburn gymnastics will compete in the second semifinal of the 2015 NCAA Championships in Fort Worth, Texas, April 17-19. The Tigers will be joined by No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 4 LSU, No. 5 Alabama, No. 9 Nebraska and No. 12 Oregon State. Auburn's rotation begins on bars and beam before its first bye. The Tigers will then go floor, vault and finish the meet on a bye. Auburn will be ranked No. 8 at the NCAA Championships, its 10th straight week in the top 10, a program record. The Tigers have only been ranked in the top 10 for 16 total weeks in the last 20 years. No. 8 Auburn gymnastics recorded its highest score ever at an NCAA Regional at Auburn Arena with a team total of 196.900, finishing second overall to advance to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2003. The Tigers saved their strongest performance of the meet for the final rotation as Auburn finished with its third-best score of the year on vault at 49.400 to lock up its spot at the national meet. Lexus Demers and MJ Rott collected pair of 9.900s, finishing tied for third overall in the event. Caitlin Atkinson and Megan Walker led the Tigers with a pair of 9.900s in the first rotation on bars to begin the night for Auburn. Bri Guy, Kelsey Kopec, Abby Millett and Kait Kluz all scored 9.8 or better on bars to help the Tigers post a team total of 49.225 in the event. On beam, Auburn scored 49.100 led by Walker's 9.900. The score by the senior was the second-best score of the night in the event and a team-high for the Tigers. Atkinson, who placed fourth overall in the allaround competition with a 39.425, turned in a strong performance on floor by posting a 9.875 as the Tigers collected a team total of 49.175. The junior's score ranked as the fourth-best score in the session.

Team Notes

The Gators will make their 33rd NCAA Championships appearance, earning a berth after winning the NCAA Morgantown Regional. Florida won the meet a 197.475 and Stanford took the second qualifying spot at 197.00. A Gator claimed at least a share of four event titles in Morgantown. Junior All-American Bridget Sloan returned with a roar to allaround competition, posting the nation's second-highest total of 2015 (39.80) in her first all-around performance of the season. She sprained her right ankle in the Jan. 11 season opener and has been adding events to her competitive repertoire since she returned to UF's lineup in mid February. Floor exercise was the final event to be added and she shared the event title with senior teammate Kytra Hunter at 9.95. Sloan's nearly perfect vault mark of 9.975 was the high score of the meet on any event. She also shared the uneven bars title at 9.95. Hunter is the first Gator to sweep a regional event title four consecutive seasons.

The Georgia gymnastics team will compete in the first semifinal of the NCAA Championships April 17 at 2 p.m. ET at the Fort Worth Convention Center in Fort Worth, Texas. The 10th-seeded Gymdogs will compete against No. 2 Florida, No. 3 Utah, No. 6 Michigan, No. 7 UCLA and No. 11 Stanford. Georgia's rotation for the first session will be vault, bye, bars, beam, bye, floor. UGA had the same rotation in the semifinal a year ago when it came in second to qualify for the Super Six. The Gymdogs (13-10) won the program's 24th NCAA regional title at Cal Berkeley last Saturday night with a 197.025. Ten-time national champion Georgia is making its 31st appearance in the NCAA Championships. Georgia opened with a bye then started competition on bars in the second rotation. Team Notes

Freshman Sydney Waltz became the first UK gymnast to qualify for the NCAA National Championships in the all-around since 2002 as the Kentucky gymnastics team recorded the third-highest regional score in team history on Saturday at the NCAA Regional Championships. UK recorded a 195.450 to finish sixth overall. It marked the third consecutive season the Wildcats notched a 195.000 or higher after they had eclipsed 195.000 just twice in program history before 2012, when UK head coach Tim Garrison arrived in Lexington. Waltz finished fifth in the all-around with a 39.125 and earned a spot at the NCAA Championships when she placed second among gymnasts who were not a member of the regional's top two teams. The Findlay, Ohio, native becomes the 11th Wildcat to qualify for the national championships and the first all-arounder since Aronda Primault in 2002. Waltz will compete at the three-day NCAA Championships April 17-19 in Fort Worth, Texas. Waltz led UK on two events in addition to the all-around. In her first career NCAA Regional appearance, Waltz opened with a UK-best 9.800 on vault. The freshman closed with a team-high-tying 9.850 on floor. Waltz also scored a 9.750 on uneven bars and a 9.725 on balance beam. Her 39.125 came in just her fourth all-around appearance of her career. It was a pair of seniors, in their final meet as Wildcats, that led UK on uneven bars and balance beam. In her final event of her career, Kayla Hartley led UK on bars with a season-high 9.850, tied for the fourth-highest score at the NCAA Regionals. Fellow senior Shannon Mitchell's 9.850 was a team best on beam. On floor, Waltz shared team-high honors with sophomore Taylor Puryear. Kentucky made its school record 11th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance and opened on vault with a 48.550. After a bye, the Wildcats followed with a 49.050 on uneven bars, the second highest total on the event this season. UK recorded a 48.850 before closing on floor with a 49.000. UK closed the season as a team after it earned its 27th NCAA Regional berth in program history.

Team Notes

The fourth-ranked LSU gymnastics team will have the home rotation by starting on vault at the NCAA Championships Semifinal II, the NCAA announced Monday. LSU (24-2) will square off against No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 5 Alabama, No. 8 Auburn, No. 9 Nebraska and No. 12 Oregon State in semifinal II at 7 p.m. CT on April 17 in the Fort Worth Convention Center in Fort Worth, Texas. This marks the first time since 2007 that LSU will compete in the second national semifinal as the Tigers go for their third-straight Super Six appearance and fifth overall. LSU will begin on vault and rotate to a bye, bars, beam, bye and floor. Oregon State will start on the bye before bars, while Auburn begins on bars, Nebraska on beam, Oklahoma on the bye before floor and Alabama on floor. For the third-consecutive season and 14th time in program history, the LSU gymnastics team won the NCAA Ames Regional with a 197.175 at Hilton Coliseum to punch a ticket to the NCAA Championships. LSU advanced to the NCAA Championships in Fort Worth, Texas, for the 26th time in school history after scoring a 49.050 on bars, 49.200 on beam, 49.450 on floor and 49.475 on vault to finish with a 197.175 and claim the regional title. LSU senior Jessie Jordan won the regional all-around title with a 39.575, and she also added the beam title with a 9.90 and the floor crown with a 9.925. It is the second time in her Jordan has captured the regional all-around title as she also won it as a sophomore at the 2013 NCAA Columbus (Ohio) Regional. Rheagan Courville won her ninth bars title of the season with a 9.90. LSU posted a 49.050 on bars to stand in second place after the first rotation. Rheagan Courville led the Tigers with a 9.90, followed by 9.85 scores from Shae Zamardi and Jessie Jordan. Ashleigh Gnat provided a 9.775, and Jessica Savona added a 9.675 to round out the scoring in the first event. LSU took the lead for good in the second rotation when the Tigers tallied a 49.200 on beam.

The Mizzou gymnastics team scored a 196.100 to finish fourth at the 2015 NCAA Norman Regional on Saturday, April 4 in Norman, Oklahoma. The score stands as the second highest NCAA Regional tally in program history, short of just the 196.500 recorded in 2010, and was the team's second score over 196.000 in 2015. Senior Laura Kappler placed fourth in the all-around competition with a career high tying 39.200, missing an NCAA Championships qualifying spot by just 0.225. She also tied for third on beam after a 9.875, while redshirt senior Katelyn Trevino and freshman Shauna Miller both tied for fourth on bars with scores of 9.850. The Tigers opened the meet with a solid vault rotation, notching a 49.000 to kick things off. The total marked the team's fifth score of 49.000 or higher on the event this season. Miller, vaulting for the first time since Feb. 20, posted a team high 9.850, followed closely behind by classmate Kennedi Harris, who recorded a career high 9.825. Kappler earned a 9.800, freshman Becca Schugel had a 9.775 and sophomore Angie Kern notched a 9.750. A career high 9.850 from Trevino led Missouri to a team tally of 48.950 on bars, upping its team score to 97.950. It marked the third meet in a row Trevino set or tied a personal best on the event. Miller continued her strong day with a 9.850 as well, while Schugel had a 9.800. Senior Becca Johnson added a 9.750 on the event. Mizzou stayed in the hunt with a 49.075 on beam, the team's second highest score of the year, to put their running score at 147.025. Kappler's 9.875 paced the Tigers, which was Kappler's seventh straight routine of 9.800 or higher on the event. Sophomore Alyson Heimsath had the best beam routine of her career, notching a 9.825, while freshmen Tia Allbritten and Miller added 9.800s. After a bye in the fifth rotation, Missouri closed out the meet with a 49.075 on floor for its 196.100 team total.
