

1 A. Right, that is correct.

2 Q. One of which you testified yesterday was an inquiry as to
3 why you were delaying in giving her what you had promised her.

4 A. No, not what I promised her, what she was asking for.

5 Q. What she was asking for.

6 A. That is correct.

7 Q. All right. And that -- so -- and there's another voicemail
8 on 3-2 of '09; correct?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Now, presumably, these are on the same phone that you have
11 the voicemails from the threatening caller.

12 A. No. Two of these -- two of the three of these phone
13 calls -- about 80 percent of the phone call were -- talked
14 about, "Who could that possibly be to make these phone calls?"

15 She was leading me to the point that it could have been
16 somebody at the clinic that got these records. She was telling
17 me it could be somebody -- she went to counselling down in
18 Louisville, for counselling down there. I was -- kept
19 inquiring, "Who do you think would make these calls?" And she
20 was getting to the bottom of, "It could be somebody from the
21 clinic. It could be somebody that she went to for counselling
22 in Louisville." And she was -- I would say 80 percent of these
23 phone calls were about who made these. She was leading me on to
24 other people.

25 Q. Okay. The genesis of these phone calls are all related to
