HOW THEY GOT HERE

Southern Illinois prefers to do things the hard way. For the fifth time in six straight postseason appearances, the Salukis opted to play their way into NCAA Tournament instead of earn an automatic bid by winning the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament.

Maybe that's a good thing, because last year, they were one-and-done in the Big Dance after winning their only MVC Tournament title during this run.

The bitter defeat to West Virginia in the first round was a driving force going into this season for a team that returned its top eight scorers, including all five starters.

The Salukis' path back to the tournament once again included stifling defense (56.5 points per game), a lengthy win streak during the regular season and a fifth Valley regular-season title in six seasons.

Valley Coach of the Year Chris Lowery's squad established the tone for its season in the first game—setting a school record for fewest points allowed in a 59-28 win over an overmatched Division III Washington (Mo.).

In their first six games, the Salukis allowed only two teams to score more than 53 points as they posted a 5-1 record.

The first time was in a 61-53 overtime setback to Arkansas in the opening round of the Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Fla. Senior guard **Jamaal Tatum**, the Valley's Player of the Year, almost won it in regulation, but went 1-of-2 from the foul line with seven seconds left, forcing overtime.

SIU bounced back the next night to blow out Minnesota 69-53, harassing the Golden Gophers into 22 turnovers and finished the Classic with a 69-64 win over Virginia Tech, with Tatum hitting a three-pointer with 24 seconds left to snap a 64-64 tie.

At 7-1, the Salukis marched into a December tussle with Indiana, but fell short 57-47 in a defensive battle.

The team bounced back again and reeled off another five-game win streak. The big victory came against Wichita State, which fell 73-68 in Carbondale on New Year's Day. Junior **Randal Falker** scored 20 points with a bad ankle and SIU never trailed in the game.

After a 4-0 start to Valley play, SIU suffered its only back-to-back losses—both on the road—of the season. Northern Iowa's bench scored 20 points to the

Salukis' four in a 66-61 win, while the Braves' 48-46 triumph came on **Will Franklin**'s basket with 0.5 seconds left.

A return to Carbondale, where SIU has lost only once against MVC foes in six years, and a 76-56 win over Missouri State helped the Salukis regroup. Falker's 23 points and 19 from Tatum led SIU, which shot 58 percent from the field in the game.

Not much went wrong from there, except for a stunning 75-68 loss to Evansville that left SIU at 14-5 in mid-January. Tatum scored a career-high 29 points, but 31 personal fouls and 14 missed free throws sunk SIU.

The 13-game win streak to close out the season began with a 58-57 victory over host Creighton. **Bryan Mullins**' basket with 4.1 seconds left turned out to be the game winner.

A 54-46 win at Wichita State carried SIU into the Top 25 in early February (21st in the Associated Press poll and 20th in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll), for the first time in two years.

A second win over Missouri State along with one over then-12th ranked Butler in the BracketBuster pushed SIU to its highest ranking in school history—13th in the AP—on Feb. 19. Tatum averaged 18 points and three rebounds in the two road wins.

The Salukis' win streak—which vaulted them to No. 4 in the RPI—came to an end in the MVC championship game with a 67-61 loss to Creighton, which had lost eight straight in the series.

The loss might have hurt SIU's chance for a No. 2 seed in the tournament, but the team had already completed its NCAA resume with 26 wins, a 15-3 conference record and a Top-25 ranking.

BACKCOURT

All the extra hours Jamaal Tatum stayed in

Carbondale over the summer paid off in a big way for the senior guard. After a horrible shooting slump dropped him to honorable mention in the Valley as a junior, Tatum came out firing this year—and from long range. His three-point shooting percentage went from 29.2 percent to 41.6 percent as he led the team in scoring once again.

The only thing that stopped Tatum (15 points per game) was a one-game suspension he served to start the year after a DUI arrest last March.

Tatum, 6-2, displayed his new three-point touch in his first game back, hitting 4-of-5 from outside the arc en route to 20 points against Murray State.

He went on to score a season-high 29 points in a loss to Evansville and scored in double digits 24 times.

Over a two-game stretch against Missouri State and Butler, Tatum led the way with an average of 18 points and three rebounds while SIU climbed up the polls.

When it comes to game time, 6-0 senior **Tony Young** is always ready to go. While Tatum is the backcourt star, Young (9.8 ppg) is not far behind. He enters the tournament as the team's active leader in games played with 135 and is one of the top three-point shooters in school history.

Young earned the only Valley Player of the Week honors of his four-year career in February for his role in key wins over Bradley and Creighton. He netted a season-high 25 points against the Braves while Tatum was slowed by an injury. Against CU, Young's jumper in the closing seconds on national television was the difference in an eventual 72-68 win.

The third backcourt member to log heavy minutes was 6-2 sophomore point guard Bryan Mullins. The former MVC Freshman of the Year had 49 assists and 11 turnovers in the final 11 games going into the NCAA Tournament.

Mullins netted the game winner in the first game against Creighton and scored a game-high 16 points against Northern Iowa.

Sophomore **Wesley Clemons** was a key contributor off the bench, providing a little of everything in 16 minutes a night.

FRONTCOURT

The Salukis' second star was up front in 6-7, 230-pound junior Randal Falker, who was chosen the Valley's defensive player of the year. Falker led the Valley in blocked shots (2.14 per game), shot 60.9 percent from the field and was one of the conference's top rebounders.

Falker finished third in the league's MVP voting and was a first-team selection. SIU missed him in the title game, where he played 22 minutes before fouling out with only three points.

He was a vital contributor during the team's 13game win streak, and earned Valley Player-of-the-Week honors the first week in February, where Falker averaged 16 points and 11 boards in victories over Indiana State and Wichita State.

The other mainstay at forward is 6-7 junior **Matt Shaw**, who emerged as the team's third double-digit scorer (11.4 ppg) and second leading rebounder (5.7 rpg) after adding 10 pounds of muscle in the off-season.

Shaw, who can play inside and out, was especially dangerous during the Old Spice Classic, averaging 16.7 points and 5.3 rebounds. He has the size to bang in the paint but can also stroke the outside shot, hitting 41 three-pointers.

WHEN SOUTHERN ILLINOIS WINS

One thing you can count on is the Salukis showing

up on defense every night. Only Western Kentucky managed to score 70 points on them this season, and it still lost, 74-71.

"You better value every possession because you're not going to get many of them," Drake coach Dr. Tom Davis said.

SIU is not afraid to get in its opponents' faces and counts on Jamaal Tatum and Randal Falker to set the tempo for its aggressive play. A low-scoring affair is what the Salukis crave, and they will beat you up to get their way.

Despite not being the tallest team, the Salukis also excel at keeping opponents off the boards, allowing a Valley-low 28.2 defensive rebounds per game.

Amazingly, SIU keeps up this intensity even without a potent bench. All five starters log at least 25 minutes per game.

BEATING THE SALUKIS

Not much seems to bother Southern Illinois, but getting into foul trouble has been a problem because the bench is not deep.

The other issue has been teams that play good zone defense, which worked for Indiana, Bradley and Evansville. Creighton added a third wrinkle to the mix with a strong inside game (34 points in the paint).

THE FINAL WORD

The Salukis finished the season as one of the hottest teams in the nation before falling in the MVC title game. They still earned a high seed for the NCAA Tournament, and if they don't let the Creighton loss linger, could be one dangerous, physical team in the Big Dance.
