• Alabama's Ricky Tarrant, a 6-foot-2, 190-pound junior guard from Pleasant Grove, Ala., was named SEC Player of the Week after leading the Crimson Tide to a win over UCLA. The junior guard struck for an Alabama career-high 24 points, including 18 points in the first half alone, en route to a 56-50 victory over the Bruins on Sunday night. Tarrant was dominant over the opening 20 minutes, hitting 6-of-10 shots and scoring 18 of the Tide's 29 first half points. He finished the contest hitting 8-of-10 free throws, including sinking the eventual game-winning free throw that gave Alabama a 51-50 lead with 49 seconds remaining.

• Kentucky's Tyler Ulis, a 5-foot-9, 155-pound guard from Lima, Ohio, was named SEC Freshman of the Week after leading the Wildcats to a 58-50 win at fourth-ranked Louisville. Ulis scored a career-high 14 points, including a pair of second half 3-pointers to lead the Wildcats in scoring in the victory to remain a perfect 13-0 on the year. Ulis' previous career high was 12 points against Buffalo in the second game of the season. He also dished out two assists with zero turnovers, while playing in a career-high 26 minutes of action in his first career road game. The five made field goals also marked a career best.

• As of Dec. 29, 10 SEC teams are ranked in the Top 100 of ESPN's RPI, including five in the Top 50.

• According to ESPN's RPI on Dec. 29, the SEC has been playing the best non-conference schedules among the five power conferences this year. The average SEC strength of schedule is ranked 82.1 nationally, topping those of the Big Ten (130.2), ACC (131.2), Big 12 (148.4) and Pac-12 (145.7).

• Eight SEC teams have played schedules that rank in the Top 100 of ESPN's RPI. Kentucky's schedule ranks sixth and Georgia's is ninth most difficult in the nation.

• According to the Dec. 29 NCAA statistics, Kentucky leads the nation in scoring margin (27.5), field goal percentage defense (29.7) and blocked shots per game (8.2) while ranking second in scoring defense (47.8). Ole Miss leads the nation in free throw percentage (78.3) and Arkansas is second in assists per game (19.6). Auburn's Cinmeon Bowers ranks third nationally in rebounds per game (11.8).

• Kentucky was the unanimous favorite to win the 2015 SEC championship in a preseason poll of media from around the league and nation. Florida was picked to finish second and was followed by Arkansas, LSU and Georgia. UK sophomore guard Aaron Harrison was the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year.

• Seven SEC players have been named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50: Kentucky's Willie Cauley-Stein, Aaron Harrison, Andrew Harrison and Karl-Anthony Towns along with Florida's Michael Frazier II, LSU's Jordan Mickey and Arkansas' Bobby Portis were named to the list.

• Alex Caruso (Texas A&M), Kasey Hill (Florida), Andrew Harrison (Kentucky), Tyler Ulis (Kentucky) and Jarvis Summers (Ole Miss) have been named to the watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award.

• Kentucky's Willie Cauley-Stein, Aaron Harrison and Karl-Anthony Towns, Florida's Michael Frazier II and LSU's Jordan Mickey have been named to the Naismith Trophy Men's 50 Watch List.

2015 SEC Tournament

March 11-15

Bridgestone Arena • Nashville, Tenn.

The 2015 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament returns to Bridgestone Arena in Nashville. It will be the fifth time that the arena has served as the host of the SEC Tournament, having also hosted in 2001, 2006, 2010 and 2013. Also the home of the NHL's Nashville Predators, Bridgestone Arena has the distinction of being one of the busiest venues in the United States over the past decade and a half, hosting more than 18 million guests during that time. Seating capacity is approximately 19,395 for basketball games.

The winner of the 13-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds are determined by the 18-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded 1-14 based on their regular season conference finish.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year layoff (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2012 tournament will be the 52nd in league history and the 33rd since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 22 of the tournament champions since the tournament resumed in 1979 have advanced to at least the Sweet 16. Three of the last 17 SEC Tournament champions have gone on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 27 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee and Florida are tied for third with four. Mississippi State has three championship trophies while Georgia, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt have two. Arkansas, Auburn, LSU and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.



SEC Tournament Tie-Breaker Procedures

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive first- and second-round byes and teams that finish No. 5 through No. 10 will receive first-round byes in the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

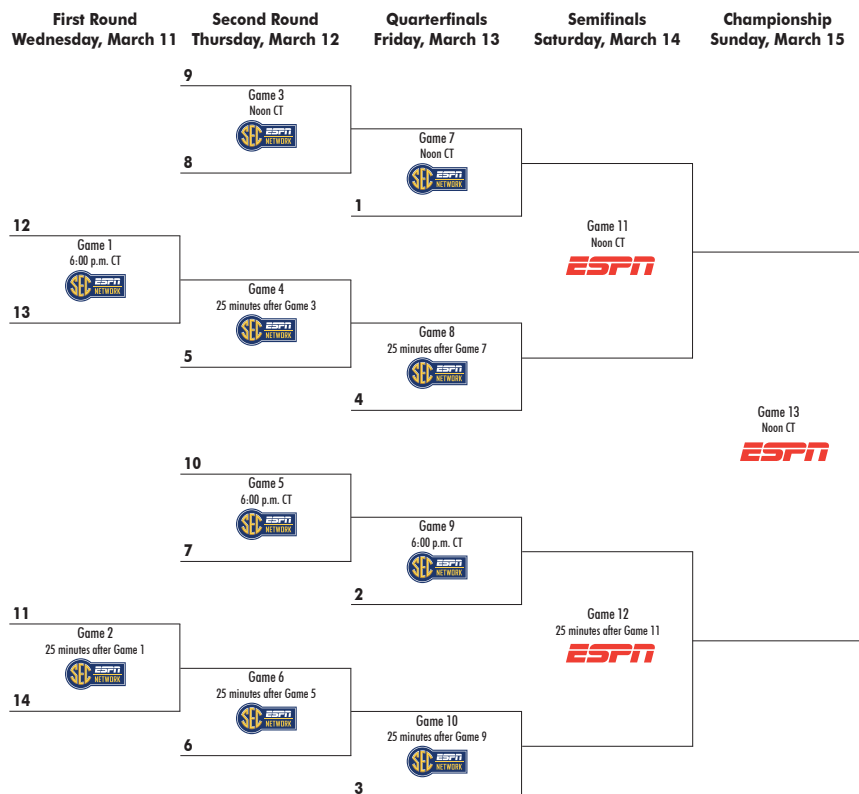
2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

For the purpose of seeding, if an institution is precluded from participating in the tournament, such institution will automatically be seeded last. The No. 11 seed will then receive a bye. However, for the purpose of breaking ties, that team will remain where it finished in the regular-season standings BEFORE being seeded last.

SEC Success

Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 11 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979).

- The SEC was 12-3 (.800) in the NCAA Tournament and 17-8 (.680) overall in postseason action.
- The SEC's 12 NCAA Tournament wins were the most of any conference (Big Ten 10, American 9).
- The SEC won 80 percent (12-3) of its NCAA Tournament games, the best percentage of any conference.
- Kentucky made its second appearance in the NCAA championship game in three years (2012) and 12th overall.
- The SEC has won three of the last nine NCAA titles (2006-Florida, 2007-Florida, 2012 Kentucky). No other conference has won more than two NCAA titles during that stretch.
- Since 1993, the SEC has won six men's basketball national championships – Arkansas (1994), Kentucky (1996), Kentucky (1998), Florida (2006), Florida (2007) and Kentucky (2012). Only the ACC (6) has won as many men's basketball titles during this time.
- The SEC has won 11 NCAA men's basketball tournament titles with Kentucky claiming eight (1948, 1949, 1951, 1958, 1978, 1996, 1998 and 2012). Florida has two (2006, 2007) and Arkansas has one (1994).
- Florida and Kentucky advanced to the Final Four and Tennessee made it to the Sweet 16. Kentucky made its 16th trip to the Final Four while Florida made its fifth appearance.
- Kentucky's John Calipari is 43-14 (.754) and Florida's Billy Donovan is 35-12 (.745) in NCAA Tournament games.
- This is the first time since 2006 (Florida and LSU) that the SEC has had two teams in the Final Four. It is the fourth time that two SEC teams advanced to the Final Four (1994, 1996, 2006).
- Florida, Kentucky and Tennessee advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. It is the most SEC teams in the Sweet 16 since 2007 when three teams (UF, UT, VU) advanced to the Regional Semifinals. It is the sixth time in the last nine years that multiple SEC teams have reached the Sweet 16.
- Every SEC team making a postseason appearance in 2014 won at least one game.
- The SEC has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 24 of the last 25 years. Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.
- Three active SEC coaches are the all-time winningest coach at their institution - UF's Billy Donovan, UM's Andy Kennedy and VU's Kevin Stallings.
- Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 11 editions of the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has won at least 65 percent of its non-conference games since the league expanded to 12 teams in 1991-92.
- Over the last seven NBA Drafts, 48 SEC players have heard their names called. Twenty-two of those were selected in the first round and two were the No. 1 overall pick.
- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 2,111 and the Wildcats' 111 NCAA Tournament victories are the most in tournament history. UK's 52 NCAA Tournament appearances are the most in the nation.

Alabama will close out the non-conference portion of its schedule when the Tide hosts North Florida on Friday, Jan. 2, at 6 p.m. CT. The Tide is coming off an impressive 56-50 victory over UCLA in its lone outing last week, which marked the Tide's third straight win and its fourth win in five games. Sunday night's contest marked the fifth game in series history between UCLA and Alabama. With the 56-50 victory, the Tide now trails in the all-time series, 3-2 and snapped a three-game losing streak to UCLA. Alabama's only other win in the series came on Jan. 28, 1983 when the Tide defeated then-No. 1 UCLA, 70-67. That day was the same day that legendary Alabama football coach Paul "Bear" Bryant was laid to rest. Alabama held an opponent to below 60 points for the fifth consecutive game, while the 50 points scored by UCLA were the second fewest points the Tide has allowed all season. Over the last five games, Alabama is holding the opposition to 35.8 percent field goal percentage, 27.1 three-point field goal percentage and 52.8 points per game. Senior guard Levi Randolph finished the night with 15 points and now has 1,010 points for his career. In doing so, Randolph became the 47th player in program history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Junior guard Ricky Tarrant finished the contest with a game-high 24 points, which marked his third 20-point game of the season. It was the most points he has scored in his Alabama career, topping the 23 he had at Xavier on Dec. 6. Tarrant ties Rodney Cooper for the team lead in that category. Tarrant and Randolph combined to score 39 of the Tide's 56 points on the night. The twosome went a combined 11-of-28 (.392) from the floor and 14-of-20 (.700) from the free throw line. The rest of the team shot only 6-of-23 (.261) from the floor and 4-of-10 (.400) from the charity stripe.

Arkansas stretched its home win streak against non-conference foes to 25 with a pair of wins over Milwaukee and Northwestern State. The two wins puts the Razorbacks' win streak at four games heading into Saturday's non-conference finale against Utah Valley. Off to a 10-2 start for the second straight year, Arkansas is led by the one-two punch of sophomore Bobby Portis and junior Michael Qualls who combined to average 33.0 points per game, good for the second-best duo in the SEC. Portis is the only player in the SEC in the top five in scoring (17.2/3rd), rebounding (7.7/4th) and field goal percentage (.583), while Qualls has a team-best five 20-point games, highlighted by a career-high 28 Sunday against Northwestern State. Either Portis or Qualls has led Arkansas in scoring 11 of 12 games. The Razorbacks led the SEC in scoring at 84.9 points per night thanks to an SEC-leading 19.6 assists, 8.0 threes per game and .407 shooting clip beyond the arc. Senior Rashad Madden joins Portis and Qualls in double figures and is the only player in the nation averaging at least five assists (5.4) in under 25 minutes per game.

Auburn men's basketball erased an 11-point second-deficit to knock off Texas Southern, 61-60, Tuesday night at Auburn Arena. Senior K.C. Ross-Miller hit a pair of clutch free throws with 14 seconds remaining and Auburn (6-5) had to fend off two Texas Southern (2-9) possessions in the final 10 seconds of the game, getting a late steal from junior big man Cinmeon Bowers to give the Tigers its second-straight comeback victory on their home floor. Senior KT Harrell led the way with 14 points while Bowers finished with 13 points and a game-high 15 rebounds to pick up his seventh double-double of the season. Antoine Mason also had 13 points, hitting 5-of-13 shots from the field including three treys. The Queens, N.Y., native poured in 10 of his 13 in the second half, pulling down three boards and swiping two steals. Mason now has 2,005 points in his career, the second-most by an active player in the country behind BYU's Tyler Haws. Auburn is the only team in the nation with a 2,000-point scorer (Mason) and a 1,000-point scorer (Harrell). Despite getting outshot from the field 42 percent to 36 percent and being out-rebounded, 37-34, The Tigers finished with 11 steals in the game, getting three apiece from Bowers and Ross-Miller. Auburn moved to 6-0 this season when four players scored 10-plus points. The victory also marked the third time this season the Tigers have overcame a double-digit deficit in the second half to earn a victory. The Tigers now break for Christmas and return to action on Dec. 29 against Middle Tennessee State at Auburn Arena. The contest will be televised on the SEC Network at 8 p.m. CT.

Georgia defeated Mercer 86-77 in triple overtime Saturday night at Stegeman Coliseum. It was the first-ever triple overtime game at Stegeman Coliseum in men's basketball history. Georgia (7-3) had five players score in double figures for the second time this season. Charles Mann paced the Bulldogs with 22 points, adding six rebounds and five assists. Nemanja Djuricic and Marcus Thornton each scored 17 points, and Kenny Gaines added 13 of his own. J.J. Frazier finished the night with 10 points. Thornton and Gaines finished the night with 11 and 10 rebounds respectfully, making them the first Bulldog duo to record double-doubles in a game since Kentavious Caldwell-Pope and Donte' Williams did so against Iona in December of the 2012-13 season. Georgia took control in the third overtime period, connecting on three-of-five 3-pointers, all from three different players. The Bulldogs also outrebounded the Bears 6-to-3 in the final overtime period to preserve the 86-77 victory.

In UK's final non-conference game of the season, the Wildcats remained perfect to begin the season at 13-0 following a 58-50 win at No. 4/4 Louisville on Saturday. With 13 consecutive victories to begin the season, UK is off to the seventh best start in program history. Four freshmen -- Tyler Ulis, Karl-Anthony Towns, Devin Booker and Trey Lyles -- combined for 39 of Kentucky's 58 points. Ulis was named the Bluegrass Sports Commission Most Valuable Player after leading UK with a career-high 14 points in the game. UK held Louisville to 25.9-percent shooting, the eighth opponent this season the Cats have limited to less than 30 percent from the floor. UK has played five ranked opponents this season, and four of the five have been held to 30 percent or lower from the field. The Cats have held 11 of their 13 opponents to 55 points or fewer and 10 of 13 to their lowest point total of the season. Louisville's 50 points was the Cardinals' second-fewest total points in a game this year (45 vs. Cleveland State). With 11 opponents held to 55 or fewer this season, UK has matched a program record for opponents held to 55 or fewer in an entire season through just 13 games. It matches the record set by the 2011-12, 2004-05 and 1996-97 teams. Kentucky will not return to action until opening Southeastern Conference play at home on Jan. 6, 2015. UK will host Ole Miss at 7 p.m. ET and it will air on the SEC Network.

Rhett added 14 as Ole Miss coasted to an 82-51 victory over Southeast Missouri last Monday. Smith had scored just 21 points on the season made just 1 of 14 attempts from 3-point range coming into Monday's game. Ole Miss leads nation in free throw percentage, hitting 78.3 percent of its attempts. The Rebels have hit 42 of their last 50 (.800) attempts from the line. Junior guard Stefan Moody is tied for the lead in the SEC and tied for 10th in the nation shooting 91.8 percent from the free throw line. With a win over Southeast Missouri head coach Andy Kennedy earned his 200th career win. Nine of the Rebels' 13 scholarship players posted a 3.0 GPA or above in the fall semester, as Ole Miss posted a record team GPA. The Rebels will return from an eight-day holiday break with a road trip to Dayton Tuesday before returning to Tad Smith for Saturday non-conference finale against Austin Peay. Ole Miss is a perfect 5-0 in road and neutral site game this season.

In last three games, Roquez Johnson is 14-21 (.667) shooting, 18-25 (.725) at the foul line and has 24 rebounds. Against the 13 teams that currently comprise the Southland Conference, the Bulldogs are 50-4 and have played nine different teams. The Southland teams the Bulldogs haven't faced are Incarnate Word, Stephen F. Austin, Abilene Christian and Lamar. MSU's last outing against the league came last season with a 68-62 win against Southeastern Louisiana in Starkville. With the win against Jacksonville, MSU avoid a six-game losing streak in non-conference play for the first time in school history. MSU has had different starting lineups the last three games and four times total this year. Against the Dolphins, the Bulldogs were 53.3 percent (8-15) beyond the arc, their highest percentage of the season. The eight made tied for the third-most this season. The 23-point margin of victory was the largest this season at Humphrey Coliseum and the second largest all year (25 vs. St. Louis). Junior forward Gavin Ware is now just two rebounds shy of 500. He didn't play against Jacksonville after spraining his ankle against USC Upstate after just five minutes of action. Against the Dolphins, freshman forward Oliver Blacked earned his first-career start. Senior guard Trivante Bloodman is 8 points shy of 500 for his career. He's also 5th in the SEC with an .846 free throw percentage. As a team, the Bulldogs are fourth in the league at .728. In his 76th game as a head coach, Rick Ray was issued his first technical against Jacksonville.

Mizzou (5-6) came up just short in one of the more exciting games of the college basketball season thus far, falling on a buzzer-beating, game-winning three-pointer by Illinois (9-3) to drop a 62-59 result on Dec. 20. Just 18 seconds prior inside the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, sophomore guard Wes Clark tied the game at 59-59 with an impressive mid-range jumper. For the fifth-straight game, sophomore forward Johnathan Williams, III led head coach Kim Anderson's squad in both points (15) and rebounds (8). Williams is the first Mizzou big man (forward/center) to score 15 or more points in five consecutive games since former Tiger standout and current NBA player DeMarre Carroll accomplished the feat during the 2008-09 season. Senior guard Keith Shamburger continues to be one of the most dependable players in the SEC, with team-best marks in free throw percentage (90.6) and minutes per game (32.8) that rank fourth and sixth in the conference, respectively. The Tigers are back in action in a second-straight neutral site game vs. Oklahoma State on Tuesday, Dec. 30, playing in Kansas City's Sprint Center. The contest will tip off at 8 p.m. CT on ESPN2.

South Carolina won its fifth-straight game with a 78-52 victory over Coker College on Sunday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks' five-game win streak is their longest since the 2012-13 season. South Carolina has held three of its last four opponents to under 30 percent from the field, with the exception being Coker, which hit just 31.0 percent. During its current win streak, the Gamecocks are averaging 77.4 points per game, while holding opponents to just 56.0, with a scoring margin of 21.4 points. South Carolina has hit 47.5 percent from the field during the stretch, while holding opponents to just 30.1 percent. The Gamecocks rank fifth nationally in opponent field goal percentage (Dec. 20 NCAA stats), and are among SEC leaders in several categories. South Carolina also defeated Clemson last week, snapping a two-game losing streak to the Tigers. The 23-point win was Carolina's biggest in the series since the 1971 campaign. The Gamecocks will next host North Carolina A&T on Dec. 30.

The Tennessee basketball team won a pair of non-conference foes last week, improving its record to 7-4 and extending its current win streak to three games. The Volunteers are a perfect 6-0 at home this season and own an impressive +5.4 turnover margin at Thompson-Boling Arena. The Vols host ETSU Wednesday (1 p.m. ET, SEC Network) in their final outing before the start of Southeastern Conference play. According to the Dec. 29 update of ESPN's Basketball Power Index (BPI), Tennessee has the nation's 17th-best strength-of-schedule. Senior point guard Josh Richardson leads the SEC in minutes played (35.2 mpg), ranks second in steals (2.2 spg) and is sixth in scoring (16.3 ppg). Richardson has scored 10 or more points in all but one of UT's games this season, and he needs fewer than 100 points to become the 47th all-time member of Tennessee's 1,000-Point Club. Among active SEC players, only Jarvis Summers (Ole Miss) and Levi Randolph (Alabama) have more career points than Richardson's 918. First-year Tennessee wing Devon Baukman has stood among the league's top shooters the past two weeks. The junior-college transfer scored a season-high 22 points in UT's win over Mercer, and he is 8-for-11 (.727) from 3-point range in the Vols' last three games. On the year, Baukman is shooting .545 from beyond the arc. Sophomore guard Robert Hubbs III averaged 10.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in Tennessee's two wins last week. Against Tennessee State, Hubbs posted career-highs in rebounds (5) and assists (3) to go along with a season-best 11 points. Junior guard Kevin Punter was Tennessee's top scorer in that TSU victory, as the junior-college transfer poured in 18 points while going 4-for-4 from 3-point range and also recording his second four-steal game of the year.

Texas A&M fell to 7-3 on the season with the 71-64 loss to Kansas State at Sprint Center in Kansas City on Saturday ... the Aggies are now 2-2 away from College Station this season. Statistically, Texas A&M held advantages in rebounding (25-24), points in the paint (40-34), points off turnovers (14-12), second chance points (9-4) and fast break points (9-6) ... Kansas State, however, owned a better shooting percentage (61.5 percent to 49.0 percent). Texas A&M has shot better than 45 percent from the field in five consecutive games and in seven of 10 contests on the year. The Aggies committed only six turnovers in the game, their lowest output in a game this season. The Wildcats held a 39-32 lead at the intermission after shooting 82.4 percent during the first period (14-for-17) ... A&M was 12-for-24 (50 percent) during the opening stanza. Senior Kourtney Roberson and junior Danuel House shared top-point honors for the Aggies, contributing 13 points apiece ... Roberson was 6-of-7 from the field, while House made five of his eight shot attempts in 33 minutes on the court. Senior guard Jordan Green scored 11 points to reach double-digit scoring for the 14th time during his Aggie career ... the Flower Mound, Texas, product was a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line while adding three assists, two rebounds and a steal. Junior Alex Caruso dished out a game-high six assists, while chipping in 10 points and six rebounds in 33 minutes of action ... additionally, Caruso notched three steals to move past Bernard King (152 steals from 1999-02) into seventh place on the program's all-time steal list with 153 for his three-year tenure in Aggieland. Following the holiday break, the Aggies return home to host Mercer on Tuesday, Dec. 30, in a 7 p.m. contest at Reed Arena

Vanderbilt improved to 8-3 on the season with a 79-50 win over Penn at Memorial Gym on December 22. Head coach Kevin Stallings won his 300th game with the Commodores, becoming only the fifth coach in SEC history to win 300 or more games at one institution, joining Kentucky's Adolph Rupp, Florida's Billy Donovan, and LSU's Dale Brown and Harry Rabenhorst. Stallings' career record at Vanderbilt is now 300-195. Vanderbilt was led by senior James Siakam, who scored a game-high 17 points. Wade Baldwin IV added a career-high 16 points, and Damian Jones chipped in 15 points. The Commodores improved on their SEC-lead in field-goal percentage against the Quakers, converting on 57.1% of their shots from the floor, their sixth game this season shooting 50% or better from the field. Vanderbilt outrebounded Penn 38-24, and outscored the Quakers 15-6 in second-chance points, points in the paint (40-20), points off of turnovers (23-12), fast break points (8-2), and bench points (29-9). Freshman Shelton Mitchell tied a career-high with seven assists, and fellow freshman Riley LaChance only scored five points, but also added four assists and career-best five steals. The Commodores' starting lineup of Jeff Roberson, James Siakam, Damian Jones, Shelton Mitchell, and Riley LaChance was the first time Vanderbilt has used that lineup this season. Vanderbilt returns to the floor after the holiday break on December 31 in a game at Saint Louis (1 p.m. CT, FSN Midwest).
