• **SEC Player of the Week** – Kentucky's Tyler Ulis, a 5-foot-9, 160-pound sophomore guard from Chicago, Ill., led Kentucky past 16th-ranked Louisville with a 75-73 victory. Ulis matched a career high with 21 points on a career-best four 3-pointers made. He also dished out a game-high eight assists – just one shy of matching a career best. Ulis was named the Bluegrass Sports Commission MVP of the game. It's the second straight year Ulis has taken home the honor. He is the first multi-year winner since the award's inception in 2010. In two career games against Louisville, Ulis has notched 35 points, 10 assists, one turnover and six made 3-pointers in 65 minutes. Ulis scored 12 first-half points to spark UK to a half-time advantage. Ulis' night was capped by a deep made 3 as the shot clock was winding down to give the Wildcats a four-point lead with less than five minutes remaining in the contest.

• **SEC Freshman of the Week** – Mississippi State's Malik Newman, a 6-foot-3, 190-pound guard from Jackson, Miss., scored a career-high 20 points against Northern Colorado on 6-of-11 shooting, including a 4-of-8 mark beyond the arc. He also hauled in four rebounds as Mississippi State claimed a 93-69 win in his hometown of Jackson, Miss. Newman is very familiar with Mississippi Coliseum, a place he won four state titles while at Callaway HS.

• SEC teams are averaging 77.8 points per game (12,684 points in 163 games) this season. That is the highest league average in at least 15 years. Since the 2001 season, the highest league scoring average is 74.4 ppg in 2008.

• SEC teams have scored 100 or more points in a game 10 times already this season. It is just the second time in the last decade that SEC schools have passed the century mark 10 or more times in

a season. Auburn and LSU have both scored 119 points in a game this season. Those are the most by an SEC team in a game since Tennessee scored 124 against UNC Asheville on Nov. 17, 2009.

• Eight different teams (UA, AR, AU, UF, LS, MS, AM and VU) have scored 100 or more points in a game this season.

• As of December 31, South Carolina is one of four teams nationally without a loss. The Gamecocks are joined by Oklahoma, SMU and Xavier as the last unbeaten.

• LSU's Ben Simmons scored 43 points against North Florida on Dec. 2. That is the most points by an SEC player since Arkansas' Rotnei Clarke had 51 against Alcorn State on Nov. 13, 2009.

• Six teams are receiving mention in the latest Associated Press poll – Kentucky (10th), Texas A&M (20th), South Carolina (24th), Vanderbilt (receiving votes), Florida (receiving votes) and Ole Miss (receiving votes).

• The Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 features seven players from the SEC – Danuel House (AM), Damian Jones (VU), Skal Labissiere (UK), Jamal Murray (UK), Malik Newman (MS), Ben Simmons (LS) and Tyler Ulis (UK).

• Kentucky was the favorite to win the 2016 SEC championship in a preseason poll of media from around the league and nation. Vanderbilt was picked to finish second and was followed by Texas A&M, LSU and Georgia. LSU freshman forward Ben Simmons was the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year.

• ESPN.com's Class of 2016 recruiting rankings has Kentucky with the No. 1 overall class while Mississippi State ranks sixth, Auburn 13th, Alabama 14th and Texas A&M 23rd (as of Dec. 14).

2016 SEC Tournament

March 9-13

Bridgestone Arena • Nashville, Tenn.

The Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament returns to Bridgestone Arena in Nashville in 2016. It will be the sixth time that the arena has served as the host of the SEC Tournament, having also hosted in 2001, 2006, 2010, 2013 and 2015. Also the home of the NHL's Nashville Predators, Bridgestone Arena has the distinction of being one of the busiest venues in the United States over the past decade and a half, hosting more than 18 million guests during that time. Seating capacity is approximately 19,395 for basketball games.

The winner of the 13-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds are determined by the 18-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded 1-14 based on their regular season conference finish.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year layoff (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2016 tournament will be the 57th in league history and the 38th since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 23 of the tournament champions since the tournament resumed in 1979 have advanced to at least the Sweet 16. Three of the last 10 SEC Tournament champions have gone on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 28 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee and Florida are tied for third with four. Mississippi State has three championship trophies while Georgia, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt have two. Arkansas, Auburn, LSU and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.



SEC Tournament Tie-Breaker Procedures

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament bracket based on the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive first- and second-round byes and teams that finish No. 5 through No. 10 will receive first-round byes in the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

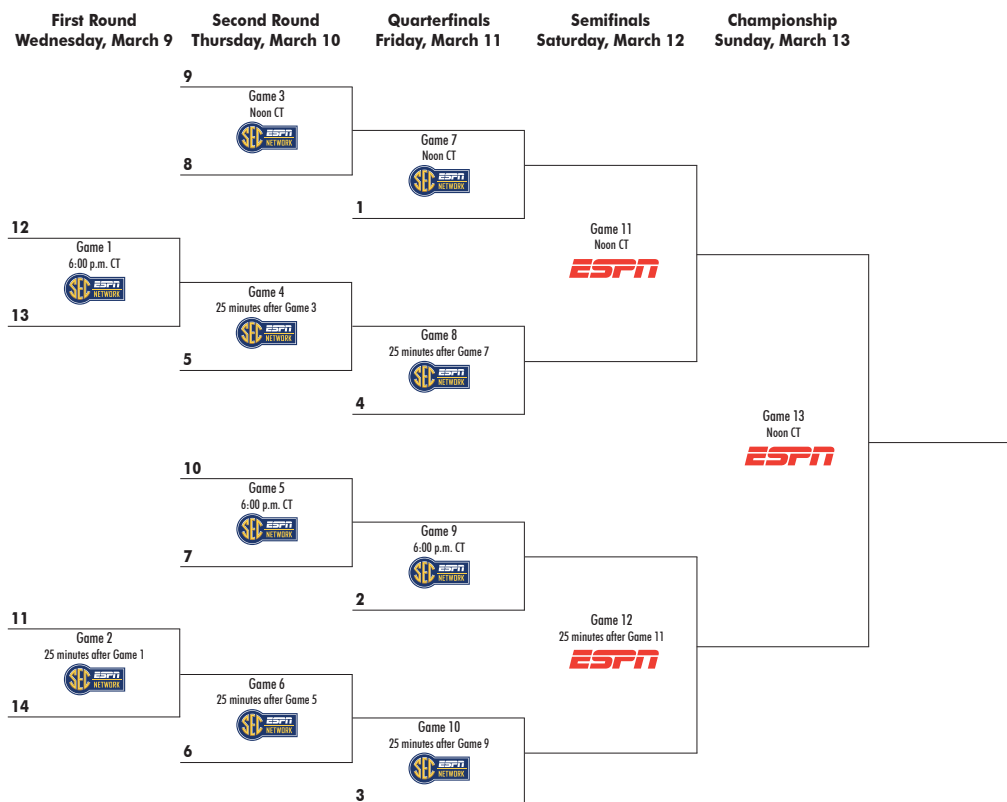
2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

For the purpose of seeding, if an institution is precluded from participating in the tournament, such institution will automatically be seeded last. The No. 11 seed will then receive a bye. However, for the purpose of breaking ties, that team will remain where it finished in the regular-season standings BEFORE being seeded last.

SEC Success

- Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 11 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.
- During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.
- Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.
- The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979).
- Ten SEC players were picked at the 2015 NBA Draft, including six first rounders.
- Kentucky's Karl-Anthony Towns was drafted No. 1 overall in the 2015 NBA Draft. He is the fourth SEC player to be picked first overall in the draft and the third in the last six years.
- Each of the six 2015 first team All-SEC players available for the NBA Draft were selected in the first 40 picks.
- The SEC's 13 NBA Draft early entrants were the most of any conference. That total was more than the Pac-12 (5), Big Ten (4) and Big 12 (3) combined.
- Over the last eight NBA Drafts, 58 SEC players have heard their names called. Twenty-eight of those were selected in the first round and three were the No. 1 overall pick.
- 2015 was the fourth time in the last five years that the SEC has had at least one team in the Final Four. Each of those four years, Kentucky has been one of the SEC's participants. It is the 12th time in the last 23 years the SEC has had at least one team in the Final Four.
- Six different SEC teams (Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Mississippi State) have appeared in the Final Four.
- The SEC was 6-5 in NCAA Tournament games in 2015. It is the sixth consecutive season the SEC has posted a winning record in the NCAA Tournament. It is the 54th time the league has been .500 or better in NCAA Tournament games.
- The SEC has won three of the last 10 NCAA titles (2006-Florida, 2007-Florida, 2012 Kentucky). No other conference has won more titles during that stretch.
- The SEC has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 25 of the last 26 years. Thirteen of the SEC's 14 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.
- SEC teams are 13-2 (86.7 percent) in postseason opening games over the last two years (7-0 in 2014, 6-2 in 2015).
- Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 11 editions of the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC played the best non-conference schedules among the five power conferences in 2015 according to ESPN's RPI. The average SEC strength of non-conference schedule was 118.7 nationally, topping those of the Big Ten (139.9), ACC (140.6), Big 12 (152.1) and Pac-12 (165.9).
- A total of 86 men's basketball students were named to the SEC Academic Honor Rolls in 2015 for having a grade point average of 3.00 or above for either the preceding academic year or a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or above.
- Alabama's Levi Randolph was named second team Academic All-America
- Forty-two SEC men's basketball students active in 2014-15 have received their degrees. Additionally, former NBA stars Lee Mayberry, Ronnie Brewer and Ronald Dupree were among players returning to complete their degrees.

The Alabama men's basketball team survived an overtime contest against Jacksonville State, defeating the Gamecocks 67-59 on Tuesday night inside Coleman Coliseum. Each team held the lead for over nine minutes in the opening half. Jacksonville State shot just 35.5 percent (11-for-31) from the floor, but the Gamecocks put up 10 more shots thanks to 10 offensive rebounds. Jacksonville State's Jared Hamilton led all scorers with 16 points in the period, propelling the Gamecocks to a 29-27 advantage, while Arthur Edwards tallied 10 to lead the Tide. Alabama held Jacksonville State without a field goal for nearly seven minutes to begin the second half. That defensive effort sparked a 13-0 burst, which was part of an extended 19-3 run that turned a 30-27 deficit into a 46-33 lead with 11:13 to play. The Tide would score only nine points for the remainder of the half as the Gamecocks methodically mounted a comeback. Jacksonville State's JaQuail Townser tied the game at 52-52 with a jumper at the 2:25 mark, and then leveled the game again at 55-55 on a trey with 33 seconds to play. Senior Retin Obasohan had a chance to end the game in regulation, but missed two free throws with seven seconds left. The Gamecocks scored first in the extra period, but Alabama would score the next 10 points to put the game out of reach. Edwards finished with 16 points to pace the offense, while Jimmie Taylor totaled 13. Riley Norris recorded a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds. Next up, the Tide wraps up non-conference play by hosting Norfolk State on Saturday, Jan. 2.

A heroic Anthlon Bell three with 1.4 seconds remaining sent the game into overtime, but Arkansas men's basketball ultimately fell to Dayton 85-81 on Wednesday night. Moses Kingsley once again led the Razorbacks in scoring with a career-high 26 points on 9-for-13 shooting from the field and 8-for-9 from the foul line. He also added 11 rebounds for his fourth-consecutive double-double. Anton Beard also notched a career high with 15 points, while Dusty Hannahs (13) and Jabril Durham (12) joined them in double digits. Down 30-7 at the 9:46 mark of the first half, the Razorbacks clawed back and finished the first frame trailing only 38-34. Kingsley kept Arkansas in the contest early, scoring 16 of the team's points and grabbing six boards in the first 20 minutes of action. On the defensive end, the Flyers hit only two of their last 10 shots in the first half. After missing their first eight attempts from beyond the arc, Beard knocked down the Razorbacks' first trey of the night at the 11:08 mark of the second frame. Arkansas would hit its next seven shots, including another Beard three-pointer to put the visitors ahead 65-62 with 5:40 remaining. It was a back-and-forth game from there, but the Razorbacks found themselves down two with only seconds left. Dayton's Kyle Davis made his first from the line, then missed the second. Kingsley relayed the rebound to Durham, who sent it ahead to Bell, who fired from the left wing over a leaping Flyer defender and in to extend the game, tied 72-72. Beard's third three of the contest put Arkansas ahead 79-75 in overtime, but Dayton scored the next seven points and hung on to the four-point victory. With the loss, the Razorbacks fell to 6-6 on the season.

This is the first time in Auburn history that the Tigers have opened SEC play on CBS and the Tigers are 3-0 at home all-time on the network. This is the 113th meeting between Auburn and Tennessee with the Vols holding a 75-37 edge. The Tigers have lost eight straight games to the Volunteers, including three of those to Bruce Pearl-coached Tennessee teams. The streak started when Tennessee defeated Auburn 94-85 in the 2009 SEC Tournament semifinals in Tampa. Bruce Pearl went 5-2 vs. Auburn in his six years as head coach of Tennessee from 2005-06 to 2010-11. Bruce Pearl is 0-1 coaching against Tennessee, losing to the Vols last season in Knoxville 71-63. The teams meet twice this season with Auburn making a return trip to Knoxville on Feb. 9. This is the 11th time Auburn has opened SEC play against Tennessee and the first since a 96-88 double overtime loss to the fifth-ranked Volunteers on Jan. 6, 2001. Tennessee holds a 7-3 record vs. Auburn in SEC openers. Auburn has a 36-46 record in SEC openers since the league's first season in 1932-33. The Tigers have lost two straight league openers and seven of the last eight and 10 of the last 12. The Tigers' last SEC opening win came in a 68-65 victory over LSU in 2013 in Auburn. This marks Auburn's 36th league opener at home with the Tigers holding a 19-16 record. Auburn is 11-27 in road SEC openers and is 6-1 in neutral site SEC openers. Auburn's Kareem Canty was named to the Diamond Head Classic all-tournament team, averaging 17.3 points, 7.0 assists, 2.3 steals and 1.3 rebounds. Freshman Bryce Brown's 20 points at Hawai'i were the most by an Auburn freshman since Chris Denson scored 21 vs. Georgia in the 2011 SEC Tournament. Tyler Harris recorded his fifth double-double of the season vs. Harvard with 12 points and 12 rebounds after having zero double-doubles in his three previous seasons.

Florida faces in-state rival Florida State in its final game before SEC action begins. FSU is the fifth major-conference opponent the Gators face this season, but the first that UF gets to play in Gainesville. In the wins vs. Oklahoma State and Jacksonville, Florida's point guards combined for 21 assists with just three turnovers (Kasey Hill – 14/3; Chris Chiozza – 7/0). In Florida's win vs. Oklahoma State, Kasey Hill earned his third career game with at least eight assists and one or fewer turnovers, matching Nick Calathes' three such games and trailing only Eddie Shannon (five) over the past 20 years. The Gators faced one of the toughest weeks in recent memory going back-to-back against two ranked teams in true road games, something the team had not done in consecutive games since 1998 and never did in non-conference regular season play under Billy Donovan. Kasey Hill, coming off the bench for the first time in nearly a year, co-led the Gators with 13 points at Michigan State. Dorian Finney-Smith also added 13, as the Gators pushed the nation's top-ranked team deep into the second half. In UF's win vs. Richmond, John Egbunu (17 points, 14 rebounds) and Devin Robinson (12 points, 13 rebounds) were the first Gator teammates to put up double-doubles in the same game since Vernon Macklin and Alex Tyus did so vs. Jacksonville in 2010. Dorian Finney-Smith added 13 rebounds as the trio marked the first time three Gators had double-figure rebounds in a game since Corey Brewer, Joakim Noah and Al Horford did vs. Jacksonville in 2005. Robinson became the first Gator since Marreese Speights to have multiple double-doubles off the bench in a season, doing so at Navy and against Saint Joseph's. Robinson moved into the starting lineup for the first time this season vs. Vermont.

11 different Bulldogs scored in the Georgia's fourth win in a row defeating Robert Morris 79-67 Tuesday night at Stegeman Coliseum. The Bulldogs head into Southeastern Conference play riding a four-game winning streak in which they won each contest by double digits, a feat that hasn't been accomplished by the Bulldogs heading into conference play since the 2002-03 season. The Bulldogs were led offensively by forward Yante Maten, who poured in 20 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Maten was joined in double figures by J.J. Frazier with 17 points. Both Bulldogs have scored in double figures seven times each this season. The Colonials cut the Bulldogs' lead to as low as five with 15:31 left in the game, but Georgia forced several turnovers on the ensuing possessions to push its lead to 52-42 at the 12-minute media timeout. The Bulldogs extended their lead to 16 after a pair of free throws from Kenny Paul Geno and two baskets from Frazier. Several minutes later Frazier put the final stamp on the game hitting a long three-pointer for his 17th point of the game. The Bulldogs held the Colonials to just 37.9-percent shooting on the game. Georgia was everywhere on the defensive end forcing Robert Morris to commit 12 turnovers. The Bulldogs never trailed in the game. Georgia begins SEC play on January 2nd when the Bulldogs travel to Gainesville, Florida to take on rival Florida at 8 p.m. ET.

Point guard Tyler Ulis scored 21 points, and No. 12 Kentucky held off 16th-ranked Louisville's rally for a 75-73 win Saturday to give John Calipari his 200th victory as the Wildcats' coach. Calipari earned his 200th win at Kentucky in just 240 tries, the fastest in UK history and the second-fastest for any coach at any school in Division I history. Ulis was magnificent for the Wildcats, who played without the services of starting guard Isaiah Briscoe. Ulis posted a career-high-tying 21 points while dishing out a game-high eight assists – one off of a career-best mark. Junior Dominique Hawkins, a Richmond, Ky., native, posted a career-high 13 points with a career-best three 3-pointers. His previous career best was six points, which he topped with eight first-half points. Senior Alex Poythress charted 14 points, three blocks and six rebounds. He scored six straight to open the second half as UK opened up its largest lead of the game. Ulis and Hawkins both drained 3-pointers with less than five minutes to go to help the Wildcats fend off of the Cardinals. UK has won eight of nine matchups in the series since Calipari's arrival in 2010. The Wildcats will return to the floor on Saturday when they open up Southeastern Conference action against Ole Miss at 7 p.m. ET in Rupp Arena.

The LSU Tigers found themselves with a chance to get an important non-conference victory Tuesday night at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, but was unable to sustain a five-point advantage in the final 8:30 of the contest, falling to Wake Forest, 77-71. The loss came on a night when LSU posted a paid attendance figure of 12,104, the biggest pre-New Year's Day attendance since LSU hosted UCLA on Dec. 17, 1994 (14,551). The 12,104 total was the 13th largest for the Tigers since the 2005-06 renovation of the seating capacity of the Maravich Center. LSU (7-5) struggled with the second most turnovers of the season (17) and 2-of-14 shooting on the exterior as the Demon Deacons ran their record to 9-3 by making five three-pointers in the second half, many of them in the winning stretch of the game. Simmons had his ninth double double of the season, scoring 21 points with 12 rebounds, but a season low of two assists. Simmons was 5-of-8 from the field and 11-of-16 from the free throw line. Victor had 19 points and eight rebounds, with Hornsby posting 13 points. LSU now will regroup and begin Southeastern Conference play with two of the first three games on the road starting Saturday at 8 p.m. against Vanderbilt at Memorial Gym in Nashville.

Ole Miss picked up an 83-80 overtime win against Troy Tuesday for the Rebels seven-straight victory and head into conference play with a 10-2 mark. The game also marked the 700th and final game in C.M. "Tad" Smith Coliseum for Ole Miss, as the Rebels open the \$95 million Pavilion at Ole Miss Jan. 7 against Alabama. Senior Tomasz Gielo scored a career-high 23 points and knocked down 5 3-pointers to help lead the Rebels to the win. Gielo also grabbed 6 boards and dished out 3 assists; he is averaging 12.1 ppg over his last eight games after posting just 3.3 ppg in his first four games with the Rebels. Senior Stefan Moody added 23 points, 19 coming in the second half and overtime, to post his seventh-straight 20-plus game, becoming the first Rebel to accomplish the feat since Joe Harvell recorded nine-straight 20-plus point games in 1992. Ole Miss will have a 10-day holiday break before opening SEC play on the road at Kentucky for the second-straight season. It also marks the 14th time in the last 18 years the Rebels have opened league play on the road.

Mississippi State is looking to win three games in a row for the second time this season. Against Northern Colorado, MSU improved to 17-6 all-time at Jackson's Mississippi Coliseum. MSU is 7-0 against the teams that currently comprise the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference — Bethune-Cookman (1-0), Florida A&M (3-0), Maryland-Eastern Shore (1-0), North Carolina A&T (1-0), and South Carolina State (1-0). MSU has used five different lineups of the year. North Carolina Central is one of four teams MSU is playing for the first time this season — Eastern Washington, Southern and Northern Colorado. The Bulldogs are 2-1 against first-timers this year, with the lone setback coming against Southern. Against Northern Colorado, I.J. Ready tied his career-high with 11 assists. Malik Newman is currently averaging 13.1 points an outing. If the season ended today, that would rank as the sixth-highest average by a freshman in MSU history. Against Northern Colorado, he scored a career-high 20 points. It was the eighth 20-point performance by an MSU player this year. Of all current players in the SEC, Craig Sword leads all scorers with 1,226 points, while Gavin Ware is tops with 739 rebounds. Ware is also third with 1,097 points. Sword also has 160 steals, second only to Texas A&M's Alex Caruso (226). Senior guard Fred Thomas is just 60 points shy of becoming the 36th player in school history to reach 1,000-career points following his season-high 13-point outing against Northern Colorado. Four of Mississippi State's starters are currently averaging 11 points or more — I.J. Ready (11.1), Malik Newman (13.1), Craig Sword (12.5) and Gavin Ware (17.8). Against Northern Colorado, MSU had a season high in steals (12) and assists (21).

Mizzou earned a 53-point victory over Arkansas Pine-Bluff Tuesday, 78-25, its largest margin of victory since Dec. 18, 2010 when the Tigers defeated Central Arkansas by the same margin. The 25 points given up is the lowest total Mizzou has allowed since Jan. 3 1947, when Mizzou beat Iowa State, 36-25. Freshman forward Kevin Puryear led all scorers with 13 points, while matching his season-high rebound total with eight. Junior guard Wes Clark (Detroit, Mich.) also scored in double figures, posting 11 points, all in the first half. Sophomore forward Jakeenan Gant (Springfield, Ga.) recorded career-highs in rebounds and blocks, with 11 and four, respectively. As a team, Mizzou posted season-highs in free-throw percentage, rebounds, blocks and steals. The Tigers connected on 18-of-22 shots from the free throw line and outrebounded the Golden Lions 56-30. Mizzou had seven players tally blocks for 11 total, while the Tigers also grabbed 12 steals. Mizzou will wrap up nonconference play on Saturday, Jan. 2, against Savannah State.

South Carolina took the court at Colonial Life Arena for the first time in over two weeks, hosting Francis Marion Wednesday night. The Gamecocks shook off some early rust and ran off to a 78-56 win against the Patriots. Chris Silva led the team with a season-high 13 points and all 15 members of the team would see action in the win. It is Carolina's 12th-straight win, matching its longest win streak since the 1996-97 campaign. Carolina connected on just one of its first six shots from the floor, but both teams would struggle offensively in the opening eight minutes of action. A 3-pointer from Francis Marion cut South Carolina's lead to just three 12-9, at the 11:15 mark of the first half, but the visitors missed their next seven field goal attempts. The Gamecocks would heat up down the home stretch of the half, scoring 21 of their 38 total points in the final 6:18, shooting 7-of-9 as a team in that span. Chris Silva and Duane Notice scored 10 points apiece to lead the team, with Silva providing a pair of highlight-reel slam dunks in the process. Eight different players scored for the Gamecocks in the first half. The Patriots finished just 6-of-30 from the field in the half, but were able to force South Carolina into 10 turnovers and recorded seven offensive rebounds to counter a slow half offensively. The home side pushed the lead up to 25 early on in the second half, 53-28, and held on to a 20-point advantage for the remainder of the game. The lead would allow head coach Frank Martin to look to his talented reserves to get some valuable playing time. Ten players would come off the bench for the team and nine of them scored at least two points. Despite relying almost exclusively on its freshmen, the South Carolina offense put up 40 points in the second half to seal the big win.

A 9-0 run late in the second half helped to complete a dramatic come-from-behind victory for the Tennessee Volunteers, 74-69, over the Tennessee State Tigers on Tuesday afternoon at Thompson-Boling Arena. Kevin Punter Jr. led UT (7-5) with 23 points, including a pair of free throws to seal the Vols final pre-conference game of the season in the final seconds. Detrick Mostella scored 16 points, the third time in his last three games that the sophomore has scored 13 points or more. Mostella began the run by nailing a jumper with 3:08. An Armani Moore put-back off a missed 3-pointer from Punter provided the final lead change of the afternoon that gave the Vols a 67-66 advantage with 2:26 to go. The Vols closed the game by outscoring TSU, 11-3 over the game's final 3:26. Punter and the Vols started out hot from beyond the 3-point arc. Tennessee hit four of its first five shots from long range, including three straight from Punter. Eight of UT's first nine field goals came from 3. The senior had 14 points at the break, but Tennessee still trailed its in-state foe by seven, 43-36, after the first 20 minutes. Mostella was the star of the second half, scoring 12 points on 5-of-8 shooting. He tied the game with a driving layup as he was fouled with 13:12 to go and gave the Vols lead, 49-48, on the ensuing free throw. After TSU rebuilt its lead, Mostella's 3-pointer with 5:54 to play brought the Vols within a point, helping to set up the final scoring run.

Texas A&M improved to 10-2 on the season and 8-0 inside Reed Arena with an 82-63 win over Cal Poly Tuesday night in College Station ... The Aggies are now 134-13 (.912) all-time inside the facility against non-conference competition. Balanced scoring saw seven A&M players tally eight or more points in the contest with four players in double-digit scoring for the first time since a win over Texas on Nov. 25. Texas A&M owned a 43-34 edge in rebounding, including 16 boards on the offensive glass. The Aggies also forced 13 Cal Poly turnovers leading to a 21-5 advantage in points off turnovers and a 10-0 lead in fast break points. Alex Caruso tied the school record for career steals in the contest, collecting two against the Mustangs to give him 228 for his four-year career ... He shares the top spot in program history with David Edwards, who had 228 take-aways from 1991-94. Caruso also dished out a game-high six assists against only one turnover on the night ... The College Station native has 27 assists and just four turnovers in his last four games. Tyler Davis enjoyed a big night, tying a season-high with 18 points on 8-of-9 shooting from the floor to go along with a game-high eight rebounds ... Davis has converted 20 of his last 21 field goal attempts dating back to Dec. 5th's contest at Arizona State and is shooting 79.4 percent for the season. The Aggies begin SEC play by hosting Arkansas inside Reed Arena on Jan. 2

Vanderbilt improved to 8-4 on the season and 6-1 in home games at Memorial Gym with an 86-61 win over Western Michigan. The Commodores shot 51.8% from the floor while limiting Western Michigan to 37.0%. Vanderbilt is now 7-1 when outshooting an opponent, and Wednesday's game was the fifth time this year the Commodores have shot 50% or better from the field. Vanderbilt had two players, Wade Baldwin IV and Jeff Roberson, register double doubles on the night, marking the first time since Damian Jones and Luke Kornet accomplished the feat against Trevecca on November 16, 2014. Baldwin had a team-high 15 points and 10 assists, and Roberson scored 11 points and grabbed 10 rebounds on the night. Damian Jones surpassed the 1,000-point mark in his career on Wednesday, becoming the 44th player in Vanderbilt history to break the 1,000-point barrier. He now has 1,007 points. Jones' 13-point game was his 9th game of the season in double figures and the 57th of his career. Baldwin's double-double was the second of his career, and the first when registering a double-double in points and assists. He scored 20 points and 10 rebounds in a 2nd round NIT win over South Dakota State last season. Roberson's double-double was his second of his career and second of the season. He posted an 11-point, 13-rebound effort against St. John's in Maui on Nov. 23. LaChance's 14 points is a new season-high. Cressler's 14-point effort tied his season high. Camron Justice returned from a groin injury after missing the previous five games. He scored three points in nine minutes of action.
